Notice is hereby given to all whom it may concern, that there will be a meeting of the Board of Directors of School District No. 1, Union County, Oregon, at the Auditorium of the Central School Building of said district on Fourth Street, in La Grande, Union County, Oregon, on the 13th day of October, 1923, at the hour of 2 o'clock, in the afternoon of said day, for the purpose of discussing and adopting the budget hereinafter set out, with the Board as a levying Board, and that at said time and place, any person who shall be subject to the tax levy, for the period covered by such budget when the same shall be made, will be heard in favor of or against said tax levy, or any part thereof, and that an opportunity will then be allowed for a full and complete discussion of said budget and the estimate published and posted with said budget.

The total amount of money needed by the said school district during the fiscal year beginning on June 15, 1923, and ending June 30, 1924, is estimated in the following budget and includes the amounts to be received from the county school fund, state school fund, elementary school fund, special district tax, and all other moneys of the district:
