

IRRIGATION TO BE DISCUSSED

VALLE, Ore. (AP).—The thirteenth annual Oregon irrigation congress opened here today, with delegates from various parts of Oregon and adjoining states, and several prominent authorities on irrigation in attendance. Sessions will continue until Friday, closing with a banquet. In addition to the discussion, which will include questions of state development and activities of chambers of commerce, there will be visits to the experimental station near Valle, and inspection of irrigated land in Malheur county.

C. M. Randall of Valle, welcomed the delegates, and there was response by Fred N. Wallace, past president. The day's program included the report of President James M. Kyle of Portland, Ore. Among the addresses of the day were:

E. B. Rothaupt, county agricultural agent, Malheur county, "Altitude Weeds"; J. W. Sawyer, executive secretary, Oregon State Chamber of Commerce, Portland, "What the State Chamber is Doing to Promote Irrigation"; R. E. Stephens, Portland, Idaho, "Business End of Irrigation"; Frank Brown, secretary Western States Reclamation association, Boise, Idaho; A. S. Emery, manager Oregon State Chamber of Commerce, Portland, "Marketing"; A. A. Smith, vice president Northwest Electric Light & Power association, Baker, Ore., "Reclamation of Power to Irrigation"; Whitney L. Bates, Portland, "Portland's Attitude Toward Irrigation"; Charles S. Albert, Spokane, Wash., "Climate Factor"; "The American Legion's Interest in Reclamation." Tonight there will be an education at lecture and motion pictures by Columbia Motion Picture company, and pictures by federal reclamation service. There will also be an address on the Translita rapids project and one on "The Attitude of the Union Pacific System Toward Reclamation."

SHREWD CRIMINALS EASILY OVERREACH EUROPE'S POLICE

VIENNA, (AP).—The many frontiers of central Europe, in some cases no further apart than a state line in America, are a great help to criminals, and much of the recent increase in a certain type of crime in this part of the world is due to the ease with which a lawbreaker can slip into another country and claim sanctuary.

This aspect of things has been brought out clearly at the international police congress that has just come to an end in Vienna. It would appear that defraudations, forgeries, embezzlements and thefts are committed with relative impunity, granted the criminal has good passport in his pocket, and gets a start of a few hours on the police. False passports sometimes serve just as well as legitimate ones. The pursuing police often are not as well prepared to follow, and must go through the slow channels of diplomacy to get permission to cross a nearby frontier.

Criminality has assumed vast proportions since the close of the war. Vienna is on the crossroads leading to many countries, and has become the sporting ground of innumerable bands of international thieves and adventurers. The Vienna police admit that the city is overrun with foreign criminals from all parts of the world, and every day discloses new methods of operation. In 1919, of 192 persons imprisoned in the forcing of currency, only 15 were foreigners. In 1921 the ratio of foreigners was 203 out of 436. There are legends of false checks, pickpockets, bank and railroad thieves, burglars, auto-crackers, adventurers and bandits without number. In one case out of ten the police find their escape because of the inability of the criminal to follow them up beyond the frontier, and their own country, and because of their own lack of resources. Last year, for example, the police authorities of the city of Vienna were unable to trace the whereabouts of the criminal who had the advantage of the police of every city. 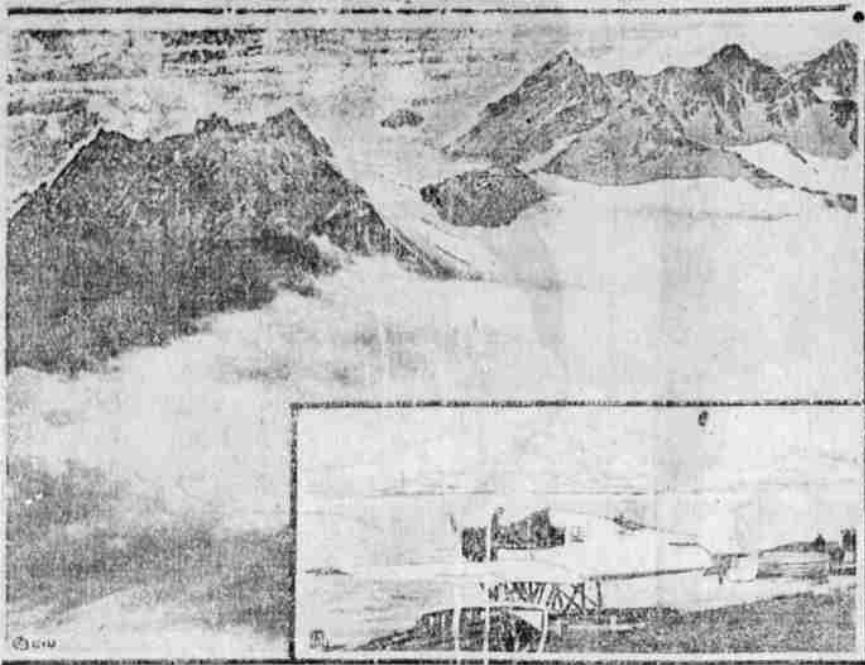

local in their activities and have no international character. Many existing formalities must be swept aside before the police can even cope with their acute opponents.

To this end a resolution aimed at better international police organization and intercourse was accepted by the congress. It will later be submitted to a primary session and, if acceptable, then go to the various governments concerned for ratification.

In the meantime the field for the malefactor is open, and the "crime wave" is rolling on, increasing as it travels.

Chicago Babies Thrive.

CHICAGO—Chicago is four times as safe for babies as it was seven years ago, according to a report of the Infant Welfare Society of Chicago. The death rate of one and thirty-nine one-hundredths of one percent for August among the babies cared for by the society in 1916 was reduced to thirty-five one-hundredths of one percent among 6,374 babies and children cared for by the organization at its 25 stations this year, said the report.

Nurses and dietitians with the society made 8,475 visits this year giving advice to mothers in the poorer districts as to proper methods of preparing food, dressing, bathing and other details of infant and child care.

MEXICO TAKES STEPS TO ENFORCE DRY LAW

SAN LUIS POTOSI, Mexico.—First steps to comply with Article 113 of the constitution of 1917, which provides that all states take measures against alcoholism, have been taken by the state of San Luis Potosi. Under a law just promulgated by the ruling governor, Rafael Nieto, the establishment of new breweries and distilleries is prohibited, and existing plants are enjoined from increasing their capacity.

Ten percent of the liquor licenses granted by the municipality of San Luis Potosi will be cancelled yearly by lot, and the manufacture of liquors of high alcoholic content will be prohibited entirely after July 1, 1925. The law is being violently opposed.

Warships Visit Sweden.

STOCKHOLM.—Sweden has been host to more naval visitors from foreign countries during six weeks this summer than ever before within so short a period, and the people look on

these courteous attentions as a sign of growing interest in the country's trade and political position in the north of Europe.

Ten countries in all have sent war vessels to Sweden, and ten different ports, including Stockholm, Gothenburg and Malmö, have been visited. The U. S. cruiser Pittsburg has just
