door advertising.

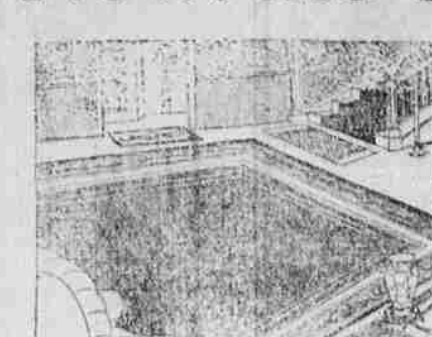
