

WORK IS BEGUN ON HATCHERY

ENTERPRISE. — Beginning the first of the week, two crews of men have made a substantial start on the improvements to the state fish hatchery ponds. One crew is strengthening the dyke between the two ponds and the other is constructing a new gate at the outlet of the lower pond, and will add to the lower dyke, making it much heavier and stronger.

Both dykes will be made eight feet wide on top, with sloping side walls proportionately thick. They will be protected by heavy rock, which ultimately will be covered with cement. For this fall, however, the rocks will be laid close and will form a sloping wall, but will not be bound together by other material.

It is not considered safe to leave the dykes without rock to protect the earth, because of the activities of muskrat and elia. The muskrats have a fondness for burrowing into earth walls along streams and lakes, but they are not so numerous as to be beyond control. But the elias are harder to handle and are persistent in their tunneling into soft earth. They have been found in tunnels run a considerable distance into the dykes, close to the concrete walls of the gates.

With both sides of the dykes protected by matched and closely laid rocks, it is hoped to hold back both pests. When the walls are cemented, there will be no question.

A miniature railroad is being built from the gravel hillside beyond and above the middle dyke, down a grade, clear across the dyke. Thin cars will be loaded with gravel at the pit by the road, and these will be run down the little railroad and emptied wherever wanted. This railroad will make it possible to haul down more filling on short notice whenever wanted. Large pipes will be laid through both dykes near the top as emergency safeguards, to carry off surplus water in case of a sudden rise.

The gate at the outlet of the lower pond will be made six feet wider than the original structure, which caved in from lack of sufficient underground support. The old abutments will be retained as part of the wall, after being moved back, and heavier new abutments will be constructed. Supt. D. A. Clanton of the hatchery, has direct supervision of the other new construction work.

In addition to the strengthening of the dykes, the plant will be enlarged by the laying of pipes to carry more water to the hatchery. It is expected that 7,000,000 fish, mostly salmon, will be hatched at the plant the coming year. The first year's operation has demonstrated that the hatchery is more efficient than other state plants, and the fishery men realize the importance of utilizing the facilities to the limit.
