Wills Knocks Out Smith In Second Round

Negro Heavyweight Flat-tens Opponent Five Times in Opening Round.

NEW YORK (AP)—Harry Wills, Negro heavyweight flat-tens opponent five times in the opening round of a 15-round match in the Madison Square Garden, Long Island city.

Smith was knocked down five times in the first round, but did not appear to have been hurt by the body punches of the negro as he went to his corner.

The second round Smith went down three without being hit but jumped to his feet when the referee started after him. Wills then clipped him in the body with a left and he went down for a count of nine. Regaining his feet he walked into a right that sent him to his knees. After a count of two, Smith rallied over on his back, stuck his foot in the air and was counted out.

The crowd seemed to take the match as a joke. Smith never once made an effort to hit Wills and he apparently was little hurt when he walked out of the ring.

Papyrus Shows Watchers Promising Burst of Speed

NEW YORK (AP)—Papyrus, the English derby winner which will meet Zeke in the \$500,000 international race at Belmont park on Saturday, 29, put over a surprise on the hot watchers at the Belmont track Thursday when he covered the mile and an eighth in 1:54 4-5 without taking a long breath.

Giving his stable hand the hint a lead of more than a sixteenth, the English 3-year-old broke that record and stepped out with a tremendous burst of speed. He picked up the Gold within the half mile and went past him as if he were standing still. Papyrus was full of vim when brought up and could have traveled much faster if necessary.

THUGS ASSAULT SAILOR FRIEDMAN

MILWAUKEE, Wis. (AP)—Beaten nearly into insensibility by three men who had kidnaped him and forced him at the point of a revolver to enter an automobile, William (Sailor) Friedman, Chicago boxer, was found lying in a pool of blood at the corner of a deserted street at midnight.

The boxer was rushed to a hospital for treatment, where it was found that he had been beaten and kicked severely about the body and where it was reported that he had received abrasions about the neck and chest, two large scalp wounds,

which had profusely and injuries to his arms and body.

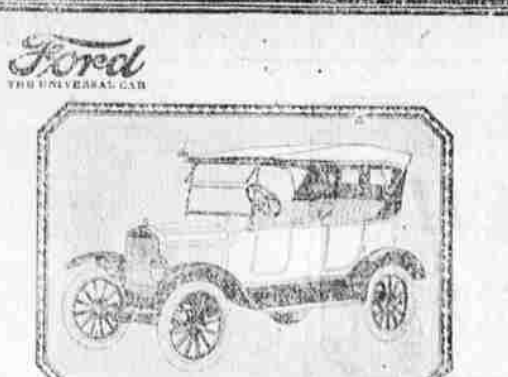
Theories as to the cause of the attack varied as the investigation into the affair opened shortly after midnight. Friends of Friedman declare they are certain that the assault was the result of a feud of Chicago iron men, who had traded the boxer to Milwaukee. Friedman, who was seized Thursday removed to a private hospital, asserted when questioned that he had recognized at least one of his assailants and that he believed him to be a Milwaukee man.

Friedman is "not in a serious condition," according to a hospital authority.

(By Scoop) Babe Ruth certainly "spouted" in yesterday's game, as the sport writers covering the second game of the world series asserted. Two home runs in one game by Babe brought him back into the public's eye with a vengeance that was startling throughout the present season. Babe's swat was not up to par but maybe he had been saving them for the world series—from yesterday's pump it looked that way.

Speaking of home runs, with two runs played, a total of five current slumps have been recorded. Both leads with two, Casey Stengel poked out one, Ward, of the Yankees, garnered one and E. Messel, of the Giants, contributed the fifth. It begins to look as if instead of a world series, the climate is becoming a "swat series."

Pinneck's pitching was nothing to be sneezed at yesterday. He allowed the Giants two runs and 9 hits but the hits were scattered and not disastrous. His curve ball was working in fine shape. Bentley and McQuillan, Giant moundmen, were easily shooed by the American star.

Society 52,762 people witnessed the first two games, contributing a total of \$146,116 to the gate keeper. Around 50,000 people are expected today and they should bring up the total receipts to about \$15,000! Prize fight crowds seem almost insignificant by comparison.

The Chicago city series fail to involve much interest from national fans, crazed with the world series bug. But in Chicago they're getting most avid crowds, nevertheless. The Cubs lead so far, having won both games, the first 4 to 3 and the second 4 to 2.

Pendleton meets Hermiston, Astoria goes to Clatskanie, and Astoria plays at Enterprise. The way things look La Grande will barely beat Union. Pendleton will swamp Hermiston, Astoria will beat Clatskanie and Baker and Enterprise will be close with the final score probably for Astoria's side.
