

NORTH POWDER SHIPPING POINT

Union County Town Enjoys Distinction of Being One of Best Shipping Points for Its Size.

NORTH POWDER.—(Special.)—North Powder is one of the best shipping points on the railroad for the size of the town. There has been thirty-two cars of live stock shipped in the past three months. The larger part of this shipping has been cattle but some horses and hogs were shipped as well.

Large amounts of lumber and ice have been shipped at the same time. The Jacobs & House Lumber Co. have shipped out large amounts of lumber and are busy cutting all the time and will ship much more. During the large amount of freight being shipped the P. F. & Co. have run short on ice and in spite of the large amount of ice stored in the large ice houses have had to ship in several cars of ice.

Several cars of cattle have been shipped in the past week to be fed at this place and shipped to the Portland markets as fat cattle. In this shipping the amounts of hay and grass which has been shipped out has not been figured and the shipments of these articles have been heavy on North Powder as a heavy producer of both hay and of grain.

Supt. Buchanan and a number of the teachers of the North Powder high and grade school attended the meeting of the teachers' institute at Haines. A large number of teachers from different parts of Baker county were present. Supt. S. S. Duncan of Yamhill county was the principle speaker of the meeting. 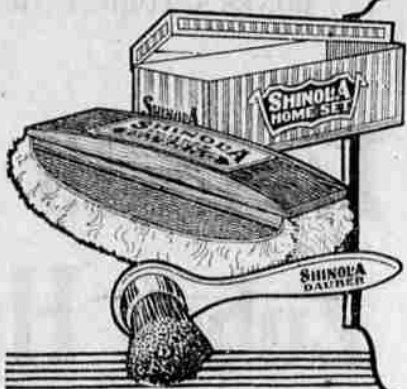

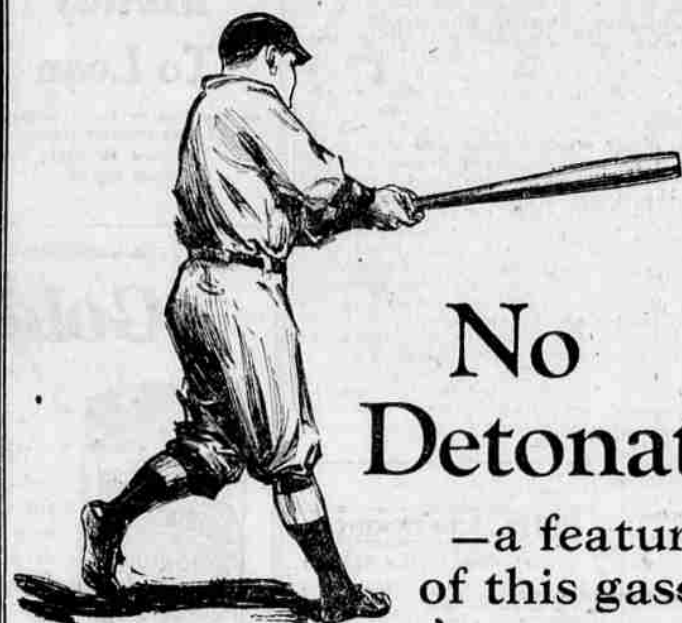
