Famous French Recipes

Mushrooms.
PARIS. (L.N.S.)—Mushrooms are pretty safe things to eat in the French capital, for every basketful that comes to the Paris markets is opened and examined by a health inspector before permission is given for it to be sold. More than fifty years ago the old-fashioned test of putting a piece of silver in the pan with the mushrooms and considering them as poisonous if the cooking turned them black was done away with. Doctors declared that most of the cases of poisoning were brought about by this very practice.

When mushrooms are cheap the French housewife makes a good conserve with butter for later use with meats or alone.

Clean the mushrooms, cut into pieces and put into fresh cold water. Drain off and put them into a casserole with a large piece of butter. Cook over a hot fire until the water they contain is completely evaporated. Put into cans or bottles and seal tightly as for canned fruits. Sterilize.
