MARQUETTE, Mich. (AP)—Five men were burned to death Monday in a forest fire near Birch, Mich., 20 miles from Marquette. The bodies have not been recovered as they could not be approached because of smoke.

Telephone lines between Marquette and the Copper country have been severed due to the fire and little information was obtainable. Crews of men to go to the fire are being organized here.
