COMMUNITY TO TRY RAISING OF SHEEP

BONNERS FERRY, Idaho, (AP)—Organization plans for a community sheep raising venture, including the leasing of a nearby forest reserve as grazing lands, are being worked out by a number of farmers of the Port-hill district, north of here.

The present schedule calls for the company to begin operations with about 1500 head of sheep, which will be sent out in charge of an experienced herder, according to W. E. Rath, one of the leaders of the project.

Excellent grazing lands in the vicinity and bottom lands capable of producing sufficient hay to winter the flock, will facilitate the plan, Mr. Rath said. Practically all of the farmers in the district, he said, who have been approached on the proposition, have or are ready to join the organization.

White China Pheasants Thrive Near Dayton, Wn.

SPOKANE, Wash. (AP)—Sportsmen of this city who for some time have insisted that numerous white Chinese pheasants were thriving in the vicinity of Dayton, south of here,

had their predictions confirmed last week when Dr. Herbert Marks of Spokane bagged one of the birds. It is a perfect "chink" in every respect, including the tufts on the head and long tail feathers, but is entirely white in color, with pink eyes.

It is thought by many the birds are, Albinos, the offspring of a cross between Chinese pheasants and white-legged chickens. The woods around Dayton abound with domesticated chickens, it was pointed out, that have escaped from nearby farms.
