SALEM, Or.—Governor Pierce has refused to honor extradition papers issued by the governor of North Dakota for the return of Mrs. Fiva Davis, who is now living in Portland. It was charged in the complaint against Mrs. Davis that she stole her own children and took them from North Dakota to Oregon, where she has a sister.

Mrs. Davis, upon being questioned by the governor, declared she had been forced to work during practically all of her married life and that her husband contributed little or no money toward her support. An agreement signed by Mrs. Davis, in which she consented to placing the children in care of her husband in North Dakota, was presented at the hearing today. Mrs. Davis admitted signing the agreement, but said she did so under duress.
