Famous French Recipes

Desserts that Nourish as Well as Please.

Now that cooler weather is here our menus must contain a greater number of calories, as if the calories which furnish the heat that keeps our bodies at an even temperature the less round. Good, nourishing food is the only real basis for health.

One way—and a good way—to add to the number of calories your meals contain without adding another dish or course, is to use shredded coconut freely in desserts and other dishes. Coconut is one of the most nourishing of all foods: It contains more than three thousand calories to the pound, or as much food value as four pounds of eggs (about 20 eggs), four pounds of fish or milk, four and a half pounds of potatoes, five pounds of bananas or six pounds of apples.

The right way to regard coconut, therefore, is as a food and not merely as a sweet. Remember that if you have a dish made with coconut you are adding substantially to the food value of your meal. Below are given directions for making desserts that are at once delicious and nourishing. But in order to get the full value of the coconut and its rich flavor, be sure to get the shredded, fresh-keeping kind packed in "ever-sealed" containers which preserve the good coconut taste indefinitely.

Cocconut and Date Pudding.

- 1 cup corn meal
 - 2 cups flour
 - 1 teaspoon salt
 - 1 teaspoon baking soda
 - 1/2 cup sugar
 - 2 tablespoons melted butter
 - 2 cups sour milk
 - 1 cup fresh-keeping cocconut
 - 1/2 cup dates, stoned and halved.
- Mix meal, flour, salt and soda; add sugar, butter, milk, cocconut and dates. Pour into a greased mould, cover with a greased paper and steam steadily for four hours. Turn out and serve at once with hot milk or any sweet sauce.

Cocconut Ambrosia.

- 2 rounds chopped canned pineapple
 - 2 cups fresh-keeping cocconut
 - 1 cup chopped mixed nut meats
 - 4 oranges
 - 2 bananas
 - 1 cup candied cherries.
 - Whipped cream.
- Skin and dice the bananas and oranges. Put the ingredients in layers in a pretty glass dish. Chill and serve with whipped cream.

Cocconut Birthday Cake.

- 1/2 cup butter
 - 1 cup sugar
 - 2 eggs, separated
 - 2 cups flour
 - 2 teaspoons baking powder
 - 1/2 cup milk
 - 1/2 cup fresh-keeping cocconut
 - 1/2 teaspoon lemon extract
 - Red currant or raspberry jam.
- Beat butter and sugar until creamy, add yolks of eggs, well beaten milk, cocconut, whites of eggs beaten to a stiff froth, flour sifted with baking powder, and then add extract. Mix and bake in two layers. Cool and put together with sugarless cocconut frosting made as follows: Beat one egg white until stiff, and add two tablespoons honey or syrup and 25 small cocconut as it will hold (about one-third of a cup). Spread the top of the cake with red jam and sprinkle over with cocconut.

Cocconut Blanc Mante with Lemon Sauce.

- 4 cups milk
 - 1/2 cup cornstarch
 - 1/2 cup sugar
 - 2 egg whites
 - 1/4 teaspoon salt
 - 1 cup fresh-keeping cocconut
 - 1 teaspoonful vanilla extract
 - 2 teaspoons cornstarch
 - 1 cup sugar
 - 2 cups hot water
 - 1 tablespoon butter
 - 1 egg yolk
 - 1 lemon
- Scald milk, add cornstarch mixed with sugar, cook ten minutes, then add cocconut, vanilla and whites of eggs beaten with salt. Pour into a wet mold and set aside to chill. Turn

out, decorate with cocconut and serve with lemon sauce made as follows: Mix cornstarch with sugar, add water gradually and cook eight minutes, stirring constantly. Add grated rind and strained juice of lemon, butter and yolk of egg. Cool before serving.

Cocconut Prune Pie.

- 1 lb. prunes
 - 1/2 cup sugar
 - 1 tablespoonful lemon juice
 - 1 cup fresh-keeping cocconut
 - Pie crust
- Wash and cook prunes until soft; stone and rub them through a sieve. Add cocconut, sugar and lemon juice. Mix and turn into a pastry-lined pie plate, cover with pastry and bake in hot oven. Sprinkle with cocconut and serve hot or cold.

Knitting Notes

Hand Knit Golf Hose Designs

Hand knit golf hose with design to match the sweater are now in the foreground. Matching the designs of the sweater, scarf, hat and hose gives a certain uniformity that adds chic and smartness where a lack of uniformity in design distracts the eye and leaves the outfit ensemble rather a confusion than an attractive uniform scheme the well dressed woman desires. Where hand knit goods are sold, the golf hose bring large prices, but the woman or girl who is clever with her knitting needles can choose her own individual design and color combination and save money as well.

Canadian Chevrolet Skating Caps in Favor for Winter Sports.

Those who indulge in winter sports will find the Canadian skating cap of Chevrolet yarn a comfort as well as becoming and stylish head dress. During the war these caps were enthusiastically endorsed by fighting men who wore them under their helmets or as sleeping caps. Knitted in Chevrolet, these caps are ideal for the out-of-door girl. They can be knit in one day and the directions are very easily followed.

Directions for Canadian Skating Cap.

Knitted with four needles. Cast on 100 stitches, 26 on one needle, 32 on each of the other needles. Knit 2, puri 2 for 3 inches. Knit plain for 4 inches. Knit 19th and 20th stitch together on each needle. Knit one round plain. Knit 15th and 16th stitch together. Knit one round plain. Knit 17th and 18th stitch together. Knit one round plain.

How to Make Pompons.

Pompons, large or small, play an important part in the wardrobe of every well dressed woman and in the interior decoration scheme. On baby's caps, on capes, sacques, pillows, curtains, they are irresistible and as a trimming for hats they are used this season with most happy effects.

To make pompons, take two circles of cardboard slightly larger in diameter than the finished pompon is to be. Cut a generous hole from the center to allow enough yarn to be caught through. Place the cardboard circles together and take a short length of the yarn, doubled for strength, to hold the pompon when finished. Stretch it between the cardboard circles letting the ends hang over both exiting places. Take a large eyed long needle threaded with a generous double length of the yarn and begin to cover the circles by putting the needle in the center cut out, across the bottom of the circles, over the top, down through the center cut out and so on, completely hiding the cardboard. Continue to cover until

the hole in the center is so small that the needle will no longer pass thru. Pompons require plenty of yarn for effectiveness. Tie the short strands of yarn that lie between the cardboard as tightly as possible. Cut the worsted yarn on the outer edges of the circles, take away the cardboard, lighten the yarn that holds the pompon in place. Fluff the pompon to make a ball and trim any unevenness, taking care not to spoil the shape of the finished pompon. The more worsted yarn used, the fluffier and more beautiful the results will be. Strawberries and other fruits made of yarn are made in the same way, finishing the complete ball to the shape of the fruits desired.

Hand Knit Scarf, Hat and Gauntlet Set.

Hand knit sets consisting of scarf, cap or hat and gauntlet gloves add charm to any winter suit. The scarf may or may not have pockets. The design can be knit to or hooked on. When hooked, the trimming can be left uncut or clipped off, to give a softer lustre or part can be clipped and part left in loops, forming a contrasting texture. Substitute for worsted in medium weight yarns hook up into beautiful lustres that would make our great grandmothers envious.

Yarn Favors for Bridge Parties.

For dinner or bridge favors, there are amusing little figures made of strands of wool. One resembles a tiny Columbine, another is a Harlequin, a third reproduces exactly the black and white garb of a Pierrot. These are made on a foundation of wire and are mounted on strands of black wool.
