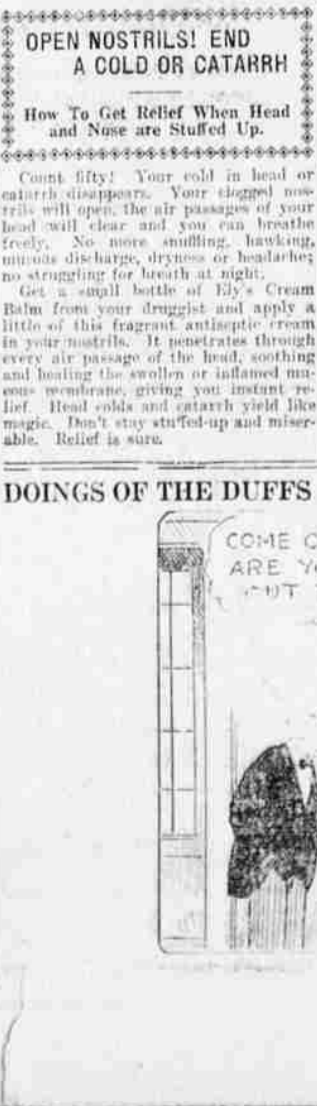
Here is a picture that should appeal to those who call continuously for "better pictures." The story itself is known to millions. Seventy-five years have passed since the book first was published. It is still popular work.
