Big Snake Starving; Keepers Are Worried

PHILADELPHIA (AP)—A giant python at the Philadelphia zoo has gone eight months without food because it will take nothing but a live animal. Keepers have refrained from feeding the serpent through fear that the Society for the Prevention of Cruelty to Animals might object. This year has been a disaster and next week the python will be fed a live pig.

The keeper appealed to Frank Rutherford, manager of the Pennsylvania S. P. C. A., who said "The snake must be fed, no matter how. While it may be cruel to let the pig suffer such a death, it is far more cruel to let the serpent expire from starvation."

Rutherford declared the pig would suffer humane death. When the porker is put into the reptile's cage there is only a sudden spring, a flash of coils, and the pig's life is extinct in an instant, he said.

Ford Said to Have Ordered Magnificent Private Car for Him

The most luxurious private car in America is being built in the Pullman car shops for Henry Ford, according to Wednesday's Chicago Tribune.

Titled bathrooms, sumptuous bedrooms, a drawing room equipped with electrically operated phonographs, as well as a broadcasting and receiving radio set and an electrical kitchen, are some of the features to be installed in the car, it is said.

A richly furnished office and accommodations for secretaries are included in the specifications, according to the Tribune.

Tunney to Meet Greb In Titular Contest

NEW YORK (AP)—Negotiations for a 15-round match between Gene Tunney and Harry Greb, respective holders of the American light heavyweight and world's middleweight titles at Madison Square Garden December 10, were completed Wednesday by Tex Rickard. Tunney's title will be the only one at stake.

The Greb-Tunney fight will be the third between this pair in less than two years. Greb won the American 175-pound title from his New York rival in May, 1932, but the ex-doughboy regained it in their second meet.

Japanese Cabinet to Reduce 1924 Budget

TOKIO (By The Associated Press)—The cabinet's estimate for the ordinary budget for the year 1924 is 1,270,000,000 yen, the equivalent of approximately \$455,000,000 in American money.

The estimate is a reduction of 101,000,000 yen under the current year's figures. The cabinet has further decided to reduce the proposed expenditures for the remainder of the current year by 107,000,000 yen.

Bomb Kills Realtor And Son; Mother Hurt

CORPUS CHRISTI, Texas (AP)—A bomb believed to have been sent from San Antonio exploded Wednesday in the home here of J. A. Barnes, realty dealer, killing him and his 12-year-old son.

Mrs. Barnes and a servant girl were injured, but not fatally. The explosion blew Barnes to pieces. The boy lived 20 minutes. Parts of Mr. Barnes' body were found in a large tree and one of his shoes were found in the room of an adjoining house, having been blown through the window. The explosion wrecked the rear end of the Barnes home and blew out the windows of residences a block away.
