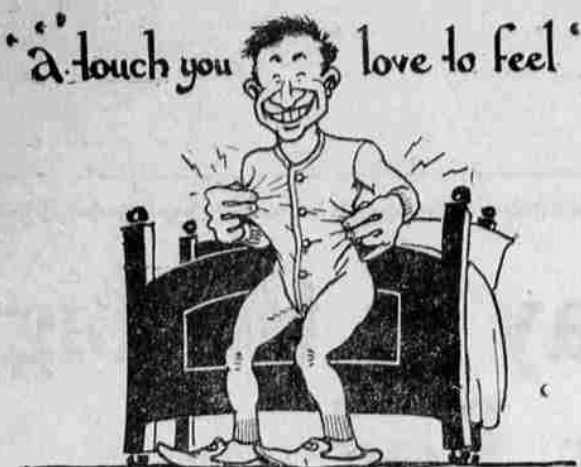

FIVE CITIES IN RACE FOR 1924 G. O. P. MEET

(Continued from Page 1)
National conventions was said to be a factor favoring the windy city. Mr. Upham expressed complete confidence Wednesday that Chicago would be selected, although many national committeemen are opposing Chicago because of alleged high hotel rates imposed there in 1923. Definite indications on room rates for convention visitors are to be demanded and are to be given, according to Mr. Upham, if Chicago is selected.

Financial inducements including all expenses of the national committee, are to be offered by all of the bidding cities. The New Orleans leaders are to urge the political effect of holding the convention in the heart of the "cotton belt," together with \$600,000 available for hotel accommodations and a new auditorium, seating 15,000 persons.

West Wants Convention.
Influence of the west is to be urged by the Denver and San Francisco delegations as a factor which the Republican party should consider, together with ample auditorium and hotel accommodations. Ohio's position as a pivotal state in the next campaign, as well as the central location, railroad, auditorium and hotel facilities of Cleveland are prospective arguments in that city's behalf.

Definite financial proposals from all the competing cities are expected. These and other information presented are to be checked up and summarized for the national committee's consideration at its December meeting, when further arguments in behalf of the various contenders are scheduled to be heard. Mr. Mulvane said he did not expect his subcommittee to make any recommendations to the full committee, but merely to present the information in concise form.

Republican leaders here expect the national convention to be held early in June, June 2 or 9 were tentative dates discussed Wednesday, with sentiment apparently favoring the latter date. Some committeemen are urging a May convention, but any consideration for such an early meeting is in such, has not yet developed.

BIDS LET ON IMPROVEMENT DISTRICT 134

With a full quorum present, the city commission meeting last night resolved itself mainly into a discussion and action on paving District 134. Ordinances were passed accepting the final estimate for Districts 124 and 125 and authorizing the recorder to give notice to property owners and either have 10-year contracts signed or accept payment in full.

Last night was the time for opening bids on District 134, which calls for the improvement by paving of Oak street from 12 to Spring avenues, including two intersections. Warren Construction company entered the only bid which was accepted. Consideration named was \$12,404.49.

The Warren Construction company was advised to complete the paving on Fifth street from Depot to Spring this fall if possible.

In addition to the paving action and the transferring of the courthouse property to the county, the commission attended to several minor matters, authorizing the purchase of several "Old Oregon Trail" longhorns from Ryder Brothers, Baker, Oregon; heard the weekly report of city manager; and allowed bills for October.

BERLIN TO REPUDIATE COMPACT OF VERSAILLES

After November 25 Germany no longer will be able to meet the demand upon her exchequer for the payment of unemployment doles in the Ruhr and the Rhineland and will then set both these regions adrift, permitting them to shift by themselves.

This direct statement was made in official quarters here Wednesday night.

Unless Chancellor Stresemann arrives at a different conclusion after pending conferences with leaders in the occupied areas, the Reichstag opposes such a policy. It is now believed that the immediate future of the Rhineland and the Ruhr will be wholly determined by the nature of agreements which the local leaders there are able to enter into with the French and Belgian authorities.

Doles Heavy Burden.
The unemployment doles which the German government is paying out to unemployed men and women in the Rhineland and the Ruhr will amount to 200,000,000 gold marks in the next few days.

An autonomous state in the present stage of occupation and under prevailing economic and social conditions is viewed in Berlin circles as an impediment and not feasible and the inclination in government quarters to favor a plan to hold the occupying powers responsible for getting the local population fed and back to work and otherwise readjusting completely the dislocation in all lines.

If the latter solution is adopted the Berlin government will invest the local German authorities with plenary powers, authorizing them to deal with the French, Belgian and British authorities, thus making the occupied zones temporarily wholly independent of intervention by the central or Transatlantic governments.

Best fat Shortlorn exhibited in the junior division among approximately 25 entries. The lowest price paid was 10 c per pound. The total amount of cash receipts ran close to \$1200.

Union County Club Cows have been especially successful this year. Most of the calves were put on feed in April or May of last year weighing approximately from 450 to 550 pounds. When sold they averaged over 800 pounds. Some of the boys came in as high as three pounds per head per day, those gains for the most part being made while the calves had milk as a supplement to the grain fed. The calves fed were all purchased and were furnished by local breeders on a contract whereby the club members receive all the increased weight of the calf and a spread of 2 c on the original weight. When finished the animals were then sold and the proceeds divided by the various restaurants and hotels on the Pacific Coast to put in cold storage for use in the holiday season.

Club members are well pleased with their year's work and the good prices received in the fat stock market and most of them are planning to begin to try to raise an even better calf for 1924.
