## TEX RICKARD PROFITS OVER 10 MILLIONS

NEW YORK — From the very modest beginning of a gambler in Texas through a sportsman's career which saw him proprietor of many noted gambling houses in the West and Northwest, George L. (Tex) Rickard today stands out as the greatest and most successful boxing promoter the world has ever seen.

Seventeen years as a promoter of athletic entertainment have seen nearly ten million dollars find their way into the Rickard coffers.

To be specific the "gate" of fights sponsored by Tex have reached the stupendous total of \$2,550,556.71, which includes his last venture, the Remick-Johnson bout. This total is the fruit of nearly 120 bouts, but before he quits the fight promoting game Tex expects to reach the twenty million mark.

"And why not?" he said the other day. "Boxing, you know, is still in its infancy."

Of his grand total Rickard has paid out to fighters \$4,500,000 and to the Federal Government \$1,250,000 in taxes.

"Bug" Slings Him.

On September 3, 1906, the fight bug stung Tex and stung him so well that he did not let him and recovered.

It wasn't the Malabar safe, but anyway it lurch of the boys were whopped it up in Tex's gambling house in Goldfield, Nevada when there was a lull in the native excitement the place afforded, and someone expressed a desire for "something new."

Glenn filled with under-colored blood were cupped for inspiration, and the "birth of a nation" in one imaginative soul put Tex Rickard on the road to fame and fortune.

"How about a prize fight?" suggested this worthy.

"Fine! Attahoy?" was the general response of the other habitués, and Tex started planning.

Visiting San Francisco, he signed up Battling Nelson, then a ring sensation on the Pacific coast, to battle Joe Gans, title-holder, for the light-weight championship of the world.

The bout was staged on September 3, 1906, and Gans and Nelson fought their famous 11-round battle, which netted Tex a \$69,715 "gate" and a neat profit of \$26,215.

Tex was off to a good start, but had difficulty in matching fighters until 1910, when, under his financial guidance, Jettie and Jack Johnson met in Reno and increased his private exchequer with a cool \$150,000 "battle of the century."

Since then his promotional fight arrow (right) has been the climax of his untold career with the Dempsey-Carpenter "battle of the century" at Boyle's Thirty Acres, in Jersey City. The battle guaranteed receipts which totaled \$1,826,500 of which Tex retained possession of something like \$800,000 and paid out about \$475,000 for construction of the world's greatest arena.

The Dempsey-Philo guarantee was his other triumph which topped the million-dollar mark.

And of all the bouts he has staged only two or three have been regarded as financial failures. The most noteworthy was the Johnny Wilson-Bryon Downey battle at the Boyle-Accroyd. The total of "sewer charges" was so stated that Tex, in a manner patently famous, dug deep into his pocket and fished out \$50,000 to let the world know he was as good a loser as he was a winner.

A few hours after the \$50,000 victory he left for the east lured by the greatest offer of his age in the United States. Since then he has won many times, national and international, his winning total is within a few thousand dollars of the greatest amount ever accumulated by any horse.
