ELGIN CRUSHER CREW WALKS OUT

Shank's Men Refuse to
Work for Sloan; Two-
Day Tie-Up Resulted.

ELGIN—A change in the operation of the rock crusher supplying the road material being used for the completion of the Indian Creek market road near here jeopardized chances of finishing this work and also shutting away of the rock slide, called the "county rock pile," just below the overhead crossing.

George Shank's crusher man who had the sub-contract to furnish rock for the Minn. Hill, Rhinehart-Klein and Indian Creek section, gave up his contract last week. The Sloan Construction Co., original contractors, took over the crusher, but Shank's crew, consisting largely of Elgin men, quit work. Not a man took any work under the new company Friday.

Monday the crew of the Rhinehart-Klein crusher was shifted down the river and the work began again. The rock pile has reached to the first bridge on Indian Creek and in a few more days the road will be secure for winter travel.

The crusher walkout is said by roadmen to be a protest against the Sloan company's method of payment. Their plan is said to be to pay at the completion of the job rather than by the week and this has caused much kick by local men who have been in their employ. Employees are forced to charge accounts with merchants and these when not paid for long periods have caused friction.

It is understood that the giving up of the contract by Mr. Shank's was the result of a controversy over who was the party to take the huge rock slide out of the river. Backing of the Elgin-Rhinehart section has utilized only a small part of the rock thrown down and most of the pile still lies in the river.

Additional equipment is now being put into place and work is underway to dredge out the pile. Part will be used in the crusher and the remainder hauled along the river. Mr. Shank is working at this and expects to have it out in a couple of weeks.
