



INDIANAPOLIS, (AP)—The American Legion, which has been pushing its Americanization program and direct attention to the need of a national educational program, announced today that the American Legion is in charge of the program for the nation.

Member posts all over the country report elaborate preparations for the work, Mr. Powell says. Working in co-operation with state, county and city governments, the Legion is now in the process of installing the program. The first annual work sponsored by the Legion, will be the most widely celebrated.

"Heavy response has been given President Coolidge's proclamation calling on this week for the purpose of bringing before the people the vital need of a national educational program," Mr. Powell says. "Governors of most of the states have issued follow-up proclamations and in these states where permits to be set aside by proclamation are limited by statute, the other executives have written to the Legion offering every endorsement."

"Many teachers came to America and in their migration community life, retain their foreign customs, language and methods of living. A program of education such as we propose is the best means of assimilating these people."

Farmers Spend as Wisely As Do Industrial Workers

WASHINGTON, (AP)—Economists of the Department of Agriculture have completed a study of the average annual expenditures of a farmer's family in Livingston County, N. Y., and find the amount to be \$2,015. The purpose of the study, which will be extended to various parts of the country, is to determine whether farmers get "adequate returns in comfort, health and enjoyment from their expenditures" as compared with the industrial family. Livingston county was selected as a general farming community of average prosperity. The most striking feature of the study, the department said, was the almost equidistant similarity found in items of expenditures of the two classes.

About one-third of the farm expenditures was figured on items not involving direct purchases—food produced on the farm and unpaid labor. Of the total, the expenditures for food was 29.5 per cent; clothing, 13 per cent; education, recreation and church and social activities, 16 per cent.

Automobiles were owned by 55.4 per cent of the families and the cost of their operation and repair, claimed under expenditures for "convenience," was \$55 a year.

Death Summons Last of Old Pony Express Riders

SAN FRANCISCO, (AP)—William Pridham, 67, one of the last, if not the last, of the famous pony express riders, died at Alameda, near here, Wednesday.

He witnessed many notable western events, including the building of the first California railroad, the installing of the pony express service and the growth of three principal California cities. He was said to have been the only Wells-Fargo employee to wear a badge for 20 years of continuous service. Mr. Pridham was born in New York city in 1857.

He carried mail between Astoria, N. C., and Smith Creek, until the pony express was discontinued. Later he served as agent, cashier and superintendent for Wells-Fargo Express company at various points.

Postage 20,000,000 Marks.

SALZEM, Ore.—Mrs. Henry Schott of Salem has received a letter from Stuttgart, Germany, bearing 20,000,000 marks postage. The writer of the letter—a relative of Mrs. Schott—said that at the time the letter was sent a quart of milk commanded 100,000,000 marks; a 100-pound box of apples cost 12,000,000,000 marks, which could not be purchased at any price.

Hearing is Granted.
SALZEM, Ore.—The supreme court state ex rel. vs. the officials of the Union high school district No. 5 in Unmulla county.

The action originated in the Unmulla county courts when certain taxpayers of the district filed suit against the school officials in which it was alleged that the district had been organized illegally. The lower court held in favor of the school district with the result that the case was appealed to the supreme court. Justice Thomas A. McBride in his opinion after hearing the testimony in the case reversed the lower court.

Grain Harvest Delayed.

HAINEES, Or.—For the first time in a number of years the threshing of grain in the Haines valley was not finished by November 1. This condition was partly the result of acreage and yields and partly on account of the growers' failure to obtain the required help during the harvest and threshing season. Farmers in the different neighborhoods exchanged work

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to meet the conditions, but were not able to keep up with the work. Threshing will continue in the valley for several days, and in a few instances harvesting machinery is still running in the wheat fields.

Astoria Hotel Fund Completed.

ASTORIA, Or.—The last of the required fund to complete the construction of the Hotel Astoria was raised today when a mortgage, given by the Columbia Hotel company to the United States National bank for \$216,000 was filed. The mortgage secures the hotel company's issue of 7 per cent serial bonds in the amount named, which have been purchased by a syndicate of bond buyers. The first of the bonds will be payable in 1925 and the last in 1933.
