Free of Sides Dates Back to Ancient Rome.

CLEVELAND, (AP)—The need of the legions of ancient Rome to feed their horses in winter led to the storing of chopped green fodder in pits. These were the first silos according to O. Braumert, of Plymouth, Ind., and 45 years ago the silo appeared in this country in Michigan.

Mr. Braumert was addressing the meeting here of the silo manufacturers department of the National Association of Farm Equipment Manufacturers. Today millions of acres dot the landscape, he said, and in the dairy sections a silo is considered standard equipment alongside the dairy cow.

Wisconsin leads all states in the use of silos, virtually all the corn crop of the state being put into the silo by means of corn binders, ensilage cutters and blowers with gasoline engines or tractors for power.

North Bend to Sell Bonds.

NORTH BEND, Or.—The local city council has ordered payment for certain sewer and paving contracts which were executed during the late months of 1923 and at the next meeting on November 27 will dispose of bonds in the sum of \$47,000. The bonds are issued under the Eddy bonding act and will run for ten years.
