aces of fine land all in fruit, having all the varieties indigenous to this latitude. In 1898 he built a fine house, a commodious barn and good out-buildings.

Politically Mr. Huffman was allied with the Populist party and with the Democratic party. While in western Oregon Mr. Huffman was nominated as assessor in his county on the Democratic ticket and although the county was Republican by nearly 200 majority, he was elected by 134 majority, being one of three that were elected on his ticket.

On July 29, 1886, Mr. Huffman married Miss Jerusha A. McAlister and two children have come to bring joy and gladness, Fred M. Huffman and Ethel A. Huffman. Mrs. Huffman's mother came to this country in 1882, being one of the noble number that crossed the plains, enduring the hardships to bring here the joys of civilization.

Mr. Huffman was a member of the present tax conservation and supervisory committee, was circuit court judge, a prominent Mason, holding many important offices at one time or another in that order, and leaves a vacant place in this community that is mourned by all who knew him.

Funeral services of Mr. Huffman will be held Monday afternoon, at 1:30 o'clock from the Spodgrass-Zimmerman Funeral Service parlors, and will be in charge of the Masonic lodge.
