OREGON CODE HELD THE BEST

UNIVERSITY OF OREGON, Eugene, (Special).—The Oregon code of ethics for journalism, written by Dean Colin V. Dymond and adopted Jan. 14, 1922, by the Oregon State Editorial association and the annual of Oregon newspaper conference, was declared by the committee on ethics of Sigma Delta Chi, national journalism fraternity, to be the best code of its kind in America.

University of Minnesota, Nov. 19, 20 and 21. Mr. Dymond, who is an associate member of the Oregon chapter of Sigma Delta Chi, is professor of journalism and dean of the college of literature, science and the arts at the University of Oregon.

The committee on ethics of Sigma Delta Chi is preparing to draw up a code of ethics for journalism similar to the one adopted in Oregon.

The Oregon code is divided into seven chapters: 1. Sincerity; truth; 2. care; 3. competency; thoroughness; 4. justice; 5. mercy; 6. kindness; 7. moderation; 8. conservation; 9. proportion; 10. partnership; 11. propaganda; 12. public service and social policy; 13. advertising and circulation.

FIND SECRET OF PROLONGING LIVES IN EQUINE WORLD

WASHINGTON (AP)—Army experts believe they have discovered the secret of animal longevity.

Old horses and mules in "active service" today have an average age of 14 years, while in the normal life of activities 11-year-old animals are regarded as beyond the age of usefulness. And the "oldsters" of the army have a secret in the cavalry, artillery or transport service, are still "young strong" in only one—a 25-year-old charger is still winning blue ribbons for performance in his class.

The secret, the experts believe, lies in regularity of diet, exercise, grooming and all the other cares which the army accords its animals in time of peace. They estimate that a five-year average increase in the useful life period of horses and mules in the service has already been proved, figuring that the 14-year-old of today will still be fit for active service two years from now.

The total number of animals in active Army service is 44,472, and the average age for all of these is 11 years. Of the 28,254 horses, 80 per cent are more than 11 years of age and of the 15,169 mules, 84 per cent have passed the 11-year mark.
