ALBANY, N. Y.—Legislation providing for immediate distribution of \$25,000,000 to world war veterans in New York will be introduced the opening week of the state legislature, according to Assemblyman David E. Jeffery, chairman of the Ex-Servicemen's Conference of the New York State Legislature.

Under the bonus referendum which overwhelmingly passed, the legislature will immediately provide a necessary bond issue and set up machinery for distribution of the awards, declared Assemblyman Jeffery.

It is not unlikely that the present organization of the State Veterans' Relief Commission which is already functioning may be given this work, according to the belief of certain legislators. This commission is composed of three men in each assembly district, a physician, an American Legion member and the assemblyman.

The bill was sponsored by the legislative committee of the American Legion in New York, and it is the intention of the law makers to consult the organization before drafting any legislation to carry out the provisions of the bonus referendum.

NEW YORK, N. Y.—The American Legion will again invade the air on Friday evening November 30th, when the fourth of the series of "Legion Night On The Air" performances arranged by the Alfred Wilson Post of Brooklyn will be broadcasted from station "WJZ."

Among the stars to perform before the microphone that evening for the American Legion will be the "Original Radio Girl" Miss Vaughn De Leath. This will be Miss De Leath's first New York appearance over the radio since leaving station WJZ to join the Belasco production "Laugh, Clown, Laugh."

Another of the many artists who will entertain that evening will be Christina Holtum, bass-baritone of California, known to his buddies of the A. E. F. days as the "Fighting Songbird." Holtum was wounded in action and upon his return from France took up the study of music as part of his vocational training provided by the government. Mr. Holtum will sing the songs that the Yanks sang in France in 1917 and 1918.

The Legion program includes dance music by an all-star orchestra, start at 9 p. m. and ending with the sound of "Taps" at 11:30 p. m.

WILL DOUBLE AIR STRENGTH

England Will Increase Her Aerial Strength Materially, Is Report.

LONDON, (AP).—Civilians will form a large part of the personnel of the British Royal Air Force, which is being increased to more than twice its present strength. Two-thirds of the men in the reserve squadrons are

to be civilians, and the auxiliary squadrons are to be organized on a basis similar to that of the Territorial Army, comparable to state militia in America. It is planned to have civilian labor care for all the repair work, other than minor running repairs, in most of the regular squadrons, all the special reserve squadrons and all the auxiliary squadrons.

By thus calling on the civilian labor reservoir, Great Britain would more than double her air power with an addition of only one-third of the present personnel, according to Sir Samuel Hoare, Secretary of State for Air. The introduction of this extensive non-regular aviation force will reduce expenditure by large sums and have the advantage of getting citizens directly interested in air development, he said.

Highly trained regular squadrons will, of course, form the backbone of Britain's air armada. These men will fly the fighting planes. The less difficult work of bombing will fall to the special reserve squadrons, made up of one-third enlisted men and two-thirds civilian employees. The reserve personnel is to be obtained by having skilled artisans enter for short periods of training in the neighborhood of their homes.
