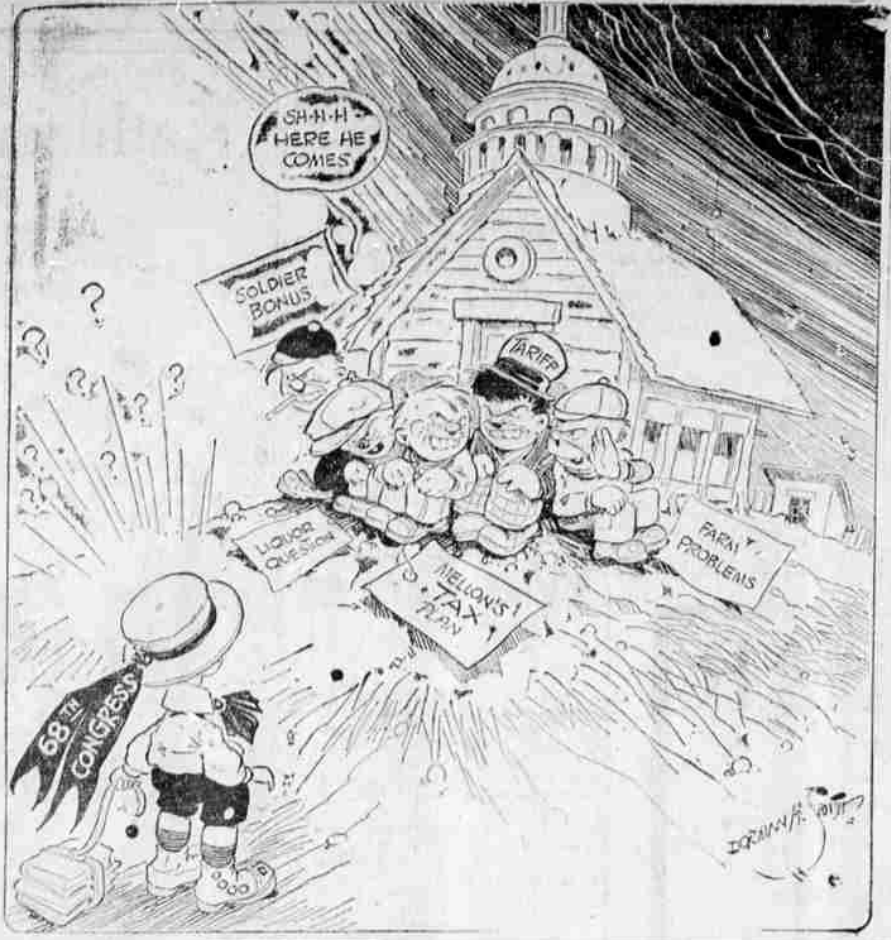

LUMBER ROAD PROGRESSING

Eastern Oregon Lumber Company's New Rail Lines Pierce Forests.

It will be impossible to haul the new main lines permanently this winter, but enough will be worked under the ties to make the track firm. After the ground has settled in the spring, ballast will be spread over the main line so that heavy trains can operate over it with speed and safety. The maximum grade on the extension is under 3 per cent, and that for only a few hundred feet.

Railroad construction will be continued all winter, it is expected. The main line will be pushed steadily north. The right of way is cleared for several miles, and the power grader is digging and filling fire-draws, removing stumps and rocks.

Eastern Oregon timber is scattered and the Enterprise mill uses up the trees from 25 to 30 acres of forest each day.

ENTREPRENEUR—Fourteen miles of new railroad grade have been built since the early part of July by the East Oregon Lumber company in the forest areas in which logging operations have been already shifted. As calls are laid out on the various lines the company will have in its control at all times such a supply of logs as has not been known in the past.

By next week the track-laying crew will be across the large bridge on the main line extension and will be pushing on north over waiting grades, to docks of logs now ready to be loaded and hauled to the mill. Thus the fore-hundred policy of President H. C. Campbell and associates is on the point of being fruit.

Steel rails are now laid on the main line extension from Davis creek north up in the large bridge on the grade which climbs out of the valley. One bridge is finished and rails laid, and construction trains operate in the edge of the second and larger bridge.

This is a trestle about 340 feet long and 47 feet high, of very heavy construction and up to the standards of best commercial railroads. The iron strikers and ties are now being laid across this large structure. Beyond it, the main line grade is ready for use for a couple of miles. The Mud Creek branch and the district which will be logged from it has seen a far greater development. The Mud Creek main line is graded several miles and three spurs, leading up shallow "draws," also are graded and ready for use.

"Type" contractors have camps scattered along all these new grades, and stacks of logs are growing larger and more numerous every day against the coming of the finished railroad, several million feet of saw logs now in these piles bridge the forest lines which have been cut for the transportation lines.

A company camp with its establishment of shortly after Swamp creek is situated up on Mud Creek between the main line extension and the Mud Creek line. This will not be a permanent camp, but will be headquarters during operations for the next year or two. It will be close to the old N. J. Brantley farm house on a flat at the head of Mud creek.

Loggings will be under way all winter in various spots in the new territory, so that there will be logs for all seasons. When the ground is frozen or frozen, there will be no risk to working on Mud Creek, and when the spring breakup comes the trains can run out on the easy line where the grade is almost like solid rock, on a well drained hillside. Swamp creek, with its spring, high water and mire, will not be forgotten.
