Shy Huntington Quits Oregon Coaching Job

Declares Alumni Opposition Is Responsible for Resignation.

UNIVERSITY OF OREGON, Eugene, (Special)—Charles (Shy) Huntington, university of Oregon football coach for the past six years, resigned today, declaring in a letter to President E. C. Campbell that he could no longer or more without a united alumni support. Students have supported him, he said, but the graduates "have carried on a sort of guerrilla warfare" against him and his methods.

The season just closed was unsuccessful, Oregon finishing at the bottom in the Pacific coast conference. Huntington, however, pointed to past seasons as indicating that he has a record of which he is not ashamed. He coached the eleven that held Harvard to a 7-0 score at Pasadena in 1918.

"I do not feel that I have failed as a coach," he wrote, "nor do I feel I have been an unsuccessful one as the season just past might indicate as a matter of fact I have won most of my games."

Huntington submitted his resignation at this time in order that the university may have plenty of time to find a successor. As the football coach is a member of the staff of the school of physical education, Huntington will remain at the campus carrying on his work in this department. In his resignation he asks to be relieved as physical education instructor as well as football coach when his contract expires the middle of June. The coach's resignation was a voluntary act.

Under Huntington, Oregon teams won 24 games, tied 6 and lost 10. "Home town psychology has been the first operated against me," wrote Huntington.

"Each year my teams have been with me, but the alumni have not. The students for the most part have been with me, particularly in recent years, and in the season just passed I have had excellent support from the student body. The alumni have demanded a 'high priced' coach, a 'steedek' or a 'colbie' or a 'Warrior' and not for a moment does it appear to have entered their heads that a 'home town boy' might possibly be a good coach."

Huntington turned football under Headek, playing quarterback. He is an Oregon alumnus.

CORNELL SCORES 320 POINTS; IS LEADING EAST

NEW YORK (AP)—Captain George Pratt, Cornell's most touchdowns and the greatest total of points, Sunny Suckerman of the same college, with the most points after touchdowns, and Captain Bill Mallory of Yale, with the most field goals, were the three leading scorers in their respective departments in eastern football in the season just ended.

Pratt made 15 touchdowns and booted eight points after touchdowns, but his field goals for a total of 95 points, six more than Tryon of Colgate, Head of Rutgers and Sargent of West Virginia, who tie for second place.

Cornell, with 320 points, led all eastern teams in scoring.

East Oregon, Mr. Dutton has selected a high school football team in the Eastern Oregon play from a reference committee and is well qualified to choose the mythical eleven.

In giving his reasons for the selection, Mr. Dutton states that at quarterback should be the greatest ability as a field general or any quarterback in this district. He stands without question as the best man for this position. In addition to his generalship, he is a "triple threat" with an exceptional eye on the offense, and is an excellent defensive man.

Newton at fullback, is the best line plunger, carrying the ball well and making yardage on almost every play. He is a good punter and shows up well on the defense, in conjunction with his selection. I wish to mention that of 120 yards, as a close second. Dutton would not be surprised if he were selected for inter-collegiate play, however, his skill on hitting the line has strained up and he has not been often steps before being tackled. Shewool Guarding

He uses punts and runs good interceptions, and can always be depended upon to do his share on the defense. He makes vicious tackling in an added defensive feature. Gilmore, of Union, had to be on a strike or punts would have excited other backs with the exception of Shewool. He was exceptionally strong on the defense during the past season, being a steady tackler and a power of strength in backing up the line. He also carries the ball well and made the greater part of Union's yardage from scrimmage.

Second Team

In picking the second team Callingsworth, Enterprise, gets left end. He played a good brand of football, passing accurately, receiving passes very well, proving a good kicker and is down on his points in a manner creditable to his position. Temple, Pendleton, is the other guard position, showed in very well. Callahan, of Union, played exceptionally well, being the most aggressive on offense and doing his share in opening holes. Walker, La Grande, did not show the ability to tackle that Walker and Johnson of Pendleton did, but his shooting was such that I feel he should be on the first team line-up and because of the scarcity of guard material, picked him for this position. McGinnis, of Walla Walla, who played a tackle position but he played well both on the defense and offense. The shooting, while not giving him the call over the Pendleton tackle, was such that he could not be selected for the other guard position.

Each Mattie and McVally, Pendleton, who carry off honors of being the best in Eastern Oregon, were especially good on offense. Mattie, who is especially good on going down on punts, also at handling punts. I feel it due to him that he should be mentioned as a close second to McGinnis.

Fine Team Strong

"There is no doubt in my mind that every man on the mythical first team would outplay his opponent on the second team should the two teams be matched. Every backfield man on the first team is able to punt, and several in the line also have this ability. The team would not be lacking in aerial attack, line-plunging, and running, off-tackle smashers, generalship and on the defensive, the team would be nearly impregnable."
