vote was 11 to 55, but it carried with it the provision that approval of the reichstag's standing committee must be secured beforehand. The reichstag had a large attendance Tuesday on the occasion of the initial appearance before it of Wilhelm Marx, first chancellor, and his cabinet. During the chancellor's address, he received only a few interruptions from the opposition. Altogether the reception of the new government was more auspicious than had been forecast in some quarters.

Urges Unity in Nation

In introducing his government the chancellor said it was neither against the right nor the left but that it was against all who wished to rob the German people of what remained to it, namely, the unity of the nation.
