



La Grande Post in Review.

At the first meeting in 1922, it was argued by La Grande post No. 43 that the post pay the hall rent of the Auxiliary, as they met in the same hall, with only a partition between. The State Department's caucus for Eastern Oregon was held in La Grande in March and it was a grand success, especially the 49-5 initiation on Friday night, and the big banquet held on Saturday night. About 25 roofs were initiated and over 100 members of the Legion were at the banquet.

Comrade Warner, of Pendleton, gave us a fine address on the last night. The night of the 49-5 show, a small horse was in the box car and when the State Officers arrived, they were put in with the horse and an impromptu parade was held down the main street.

The post got actively behind the planting of 250 maple trees along the Victory way. Personal help was given and it was held to delay the expenses of hiring an expert horticulturist.

The manual of ceremonies for opening and closing all meetings was inaugurated in April and it has added to the interest of the meetings since.

When the late President Harding made a stop in Eastern Oregon a cavalry troop was suggested to escort him while on the Old Oregon Trail Pageant Grounds. The post, with Commander Huron heading it, got behind the idea and made a very successful event of it. About forty men answered the Commander's call and trained faithfully every night for two weeks.

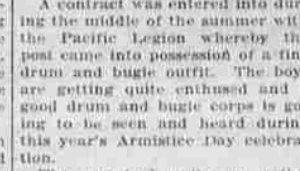
At this same Pageant, I saw a good chance to make some money for Oregon's grave monuments fund by selling souvenirs. Five thousand souvenirs, costing \$1000 were prepared and sold, and the post made \$839.00 which gave Oregon a very decided lift on the fund.

One of the more serious things that has been discussed to some length by the post is the buying of a lot in a local cemetery and using it for ex-service men who would otherwise be buried in the potter's field, and also for those who wish to be buried there.

Several most enjoyable parties were had out at the city park during the summer. The Auxiliary would fix baskets of lunch and after short meetings, eating and dancing were indulged in.

A contract was entered into during the middle of the summer with the Pacific Legion whereby the post came into possession of a fine drum and bugle outfit. The boys are getting quite enthused and a good drum and bugle corps is going to be seen and heard during this year's Armistice Day celebration.
