"But I am thankful now that I was given the solid groundwork I received at that time. Later I went to Berlin to study with Mrs. Teresa Carreno, whose pupil I was until her death, a few years ago."

N. Y. WILL HAVE FIRST COLLEGE FOR U. S. JEWRY

NEW YORK, (INS)—A Jewish college—the first institution of its kind in America—giving courses and degrees similar to those offered in American schools of higher learning, will be established in New York, according to an announcement made at the annual commencement exercises of the Rabbi Isaac Elchanan Theological Seminary held here today.

Dr. Herbert S. Goldstein, president of the Union of Orthodox Jewish Congregations, announced the building of the college as part of a plan to widen the scope and influence of the seminary, which is the oldest and largest Orthodox Jewish institution of its kind in America.

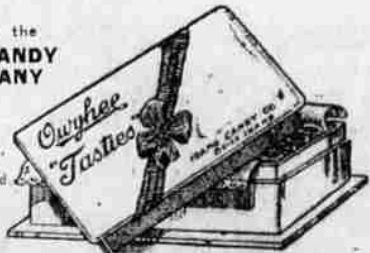
