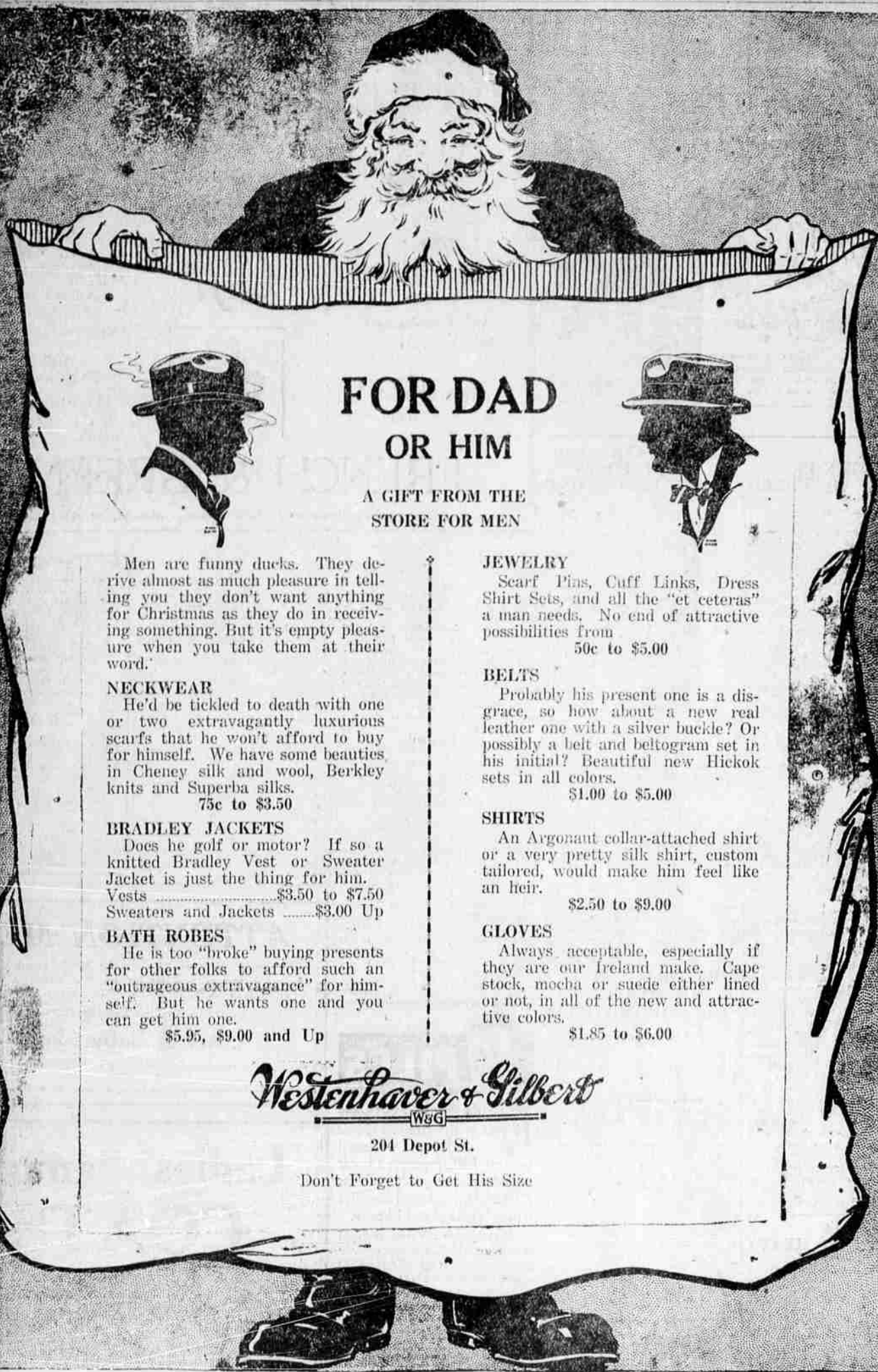

Oregon Property Is Worth One Billion

SALEM, Or.—The total value of taxable property in Oregon, including that equalized by the state board of equalization and appraised by the state tax commission, is \$1,042,410,818.66, according to a report prepared by Earl Palmer, state tax commissioner. Last year the total value of the taxable property was \$1,009,499,166.75. Taxable property in Union county is placed at \$29,209,760; in Wallowa county \$12,488,415; in Baker county \$29,252,210; and in Umatilla county \$44,616,497.

The State Highway department reports the highways open all about one foot of snow on the top of the Blue Mountains at evening.

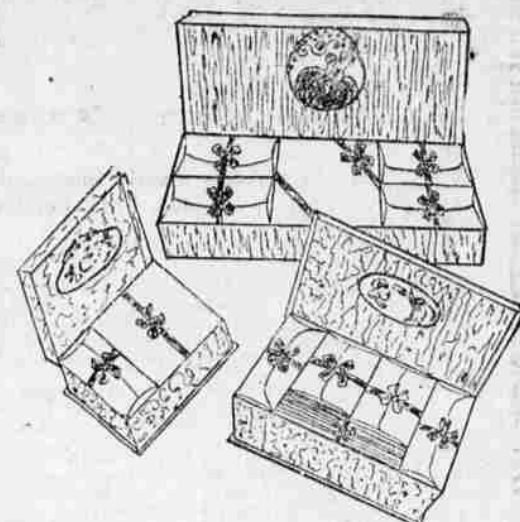
Who were driving the cars that fell by the wayside? Near Hot Lake and Union could not be located today but reports of the collision near this city were made to the sheriff's office.

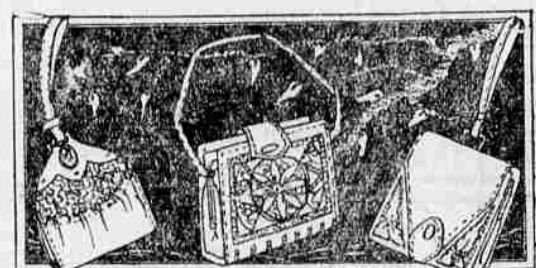
