amended the Organic Act of the territory to include Hawaii in all government appropriations applicable to State the territory has been left out of Federal appropriations for national maternity legislation. The Territorial Legislature at its regular session of 1922 passed an act setting forth the historical record of annexation, re-asserting Hawaii's right to complete recognition as an integral part of the American Union and authorizing the Governor to appoint a special commission to co-operate with the Delegate to Congress in presenting this situation to the United States Congress. This declaration has become popularly known as Hawaii's Bill of Rights, and its chief significance is that the people of this territory—far from having any thought of independence—expressed their desire to be included in the full status of Statehood. The large alien population in Hawaii was reported to have created a "serious problem."
