Scott High Wins Title On Gridiron

Cedar Rapids High Loses 21 to 24 in Thrilling Saturday Game.

TOLEDO, O. (AP)—A field goal drop kicked by Capt. Eddie Evans late in the final period with only a few minutes to play and the score tied, 21 to 21, gave Scott high a 24 to 21 victory over Washington high of Cedar Rapids, Ia., here Saturday. The victory, coming after one of the most thrilling gridiron battles in high school history, gave Scott the national inter-school championship.

The teams battled through the first quarter without scoring but in the second period Scott scored twice. A forward pass Evans to Allen on the fourth down and seven yards to go, counted the first touchdown of the game. A short time later Scott worked the ball to the "lawless" five inch line and Laurer crashed over on a quarter back sneak. Evans kicked both goals.

After a short skirmish in the third period Scott worked the ball to Cedar Rapids' one yard line and Laurer, after two attempts had failed, crashed through tight tackle for another touchdown. Evans kicked goal and the score was 21 to 6.

Iovann's Score.

But here the Cedar Rapids offense built largely around half-back Elmer Iovann, one of the best men who ever played on a high school gridiron, began to function. On the first play after the kickoff, Marek was given the ball, knifed his way through a broken field and ran 45 yards to a touchdown. Shortly after Scott again led the ball on downs and Marek, running and chugging tackled the ball on the three yard line and left tackle for another touchdown. Scott failed to gain and Marek, through an open field, ran 70 yards to a touchdown.

He kicked the three goals, scoring all of his team's points. Scott held the fourth period and Evans drop kick broke the tie. Scott made 12 first downs and Cedar Rapids nine. The crowd was estimated at more than 20,000.

TITLE TO BIG ACREAGE WON

Homesteaders Win Title to Nine Million Acres; Enter 6,000,000 More.

WASHINGTON.—The activities of the Federal government in the public lands during the last year were reviewed at length in the annual report of William Stryker, Commissioner of the General Land Office, to the Secretary of the Interior.

The total acreage of public and Indian land strictly entered and surveyed during the fiscal year ending June 30 was 2,412,000 acres. During the same period 9,995,000 acres were patented, the land being devoted substantially, according to Commissioner Stryker, to home building and farm purposes.

Land receipts from sales, leases and other disposition of public lands for the fiscal year aggregated \$10,300,447.72, 85 per cent of the total proceeds from such sources.

of public lands are paid to the public land States by which such sales are made, and the balance of the net receipts from the sales included within the reclamation act, together with the net receipts from fees and commissions from the same States are paid into the reclamation fund; 50 per cent of the receipts under the mineral-leasing act from lands outside of fiscal jurisdiction are divided equally between the States from which the minerals are taken and the reclamation fund. Under this plan of distribution the reclamation fund received \$5,075,969.66, while the several States received \$2,537,984.83.

The protection of the public lands from wrongful appropriation is entrusted to this branch of the General Land Office, and during this year the total amount of cash collected and returned into the Treasury as the result of its work was \$512,256.46, a large proportion of which was recovered through civil and criminal actions in cases of encroachments on public lands and violations of the public land laws.

As the result of investigations by the Field Service 199,650 acres have been restored to the public domain through proceedings based upon special agents' reports, while 19,277 acres were investigated, of which number 12,914 were favorably reported and 2,222 adversely.

The General Land Office during the year patented and placed on file as the basis for the disposal of public lands.

At the beginning of last year there were on file 2,922 cases, and during the year 51,100 cases were received, and there are now pending 52,022 cases. In other words, the General Land Office is up to date in handling its homestead work.

The number of entries allowed under this act during the present fiscal year is 16,718, which covers an area of 4,757,899 acres. The total number of entries allowed under this act since its passage is 31,642 and the acreage embraced in these entries 20,045,932 acres while the acreage patented under this law at the end of this fiscal year is 7,141,174.

three-quarters of the present year. An analysis of these sales shows that the sentiment is not alone among passenger car buyers but extends to commercial car purchasers who are finding that the smaller motor haulage unit offers more efficient, speedy and economical delivery service.

Sales of Ford cars and trucks in the United States for the first nine months of the year totaled 1,243,929, it is just announced. This is an increase of 459,423 over the same months of 1922.
