LONDON.—Fans are fashionable again. Not the kind of fan, perhaps, that Mme. La Pampadour loved to own.

Children skin, delicate, white. Painted by Carl Vanlooy. Lovers in a riot of light. Roses and vapors blue.

"Back to the dainty Iron-fan. Picture above, if you can. Eyes that could melt at the dew. This was Pampadour's fan."

But a very stately affair, for all that.

"The really smart fan of the moment is a monstrous affair of waxed ostrich feathers set in tortoise shell or ivory, or enamel. And if the designer can manage to work in a few diamonds or some paste, all the better for the owner."

Mrs. Nineteen Twenty-three can afford herself, if she feels like it, behind a four-foot feathered barrier, clad to carry three feathers set in costly sockets and rather suggestive of the Prince of Wales' feathers, or was aloft a single feather tied with a bow of silver or gold ribbon. HONOR UNION COUNTY YOUTH

Marvin Daniels, Cove, and Gale DeLay, Hot Lake, Awarded Recognition.

Marvin Daniels, of Cove a member of the Dairy club, has been awarded the \$75 Union Pacific Scholarship and free transportation which is given the best record in farm crop and live stock club work in such county. According to L. C. Seymour, Club Leader, in Marvin's work for the year he made the following achievements: Member of the stock judging team from this county at the international, one of two high rearing boys at state fair, entered his record in dairy herd testing at the state fair thereby getting free trip to summer school, and in addition to this he exhibited his registered Holstein heifer which he secured from Mr. W. T. Puy, at the Union Stock Show, Elgin, Pa., and Pacific International. At the local fair he won blue ribbons showing him in open class. In the Pacific International he won first in club classes and his heifer was selected by the Holstein breeders, as one of ten which make up the Oregon state herds shown in competition with other state herds. Besides this he was a member of the corn club and grew a heavy crop, the yield of which has not yet been learned. He is enrolled for next year and is now attending High School at Cove.
