Passion Play Actors Are Now in America

stolid and red-bearded, who plays Judah; Joseph Albrecht, the apostle James and Emmanuel Lang, brother of Andreas, ar., and fellow traitor of Judah in the pageant. The others were musicians and chorister.

Anton Lang Traveler.
Anton Lang is the only one of the party who has ever before left Bavaria. To his simple fellow villagers he is a wide traveled man, having gone to Italy once, and on another occasion to the Holy Land for local color and inspiration in his role of the Savior. He, too, is the only linguist of the party, speaking good English and acting as interpreter for his German-speaking companions.

These simple folks are wood carvers, makers of crucifixes, rosaries and holy images and toys, with the exception of Anton Lang, a potter. They are here to save their passion play, which has a financial deficit threatening its continued existence after the deplorable performances since 1922, when it came to life as a pledge

to God for having stopped the plague which followed the Thirty Years war.
Any money left over will go to the relief of their 200 fellow villagers. If there is any left after that, it will go to the post-war sufferers of Bavaria.

To Tour Country.
After a three weeks' exhibition of their carvings, pictures and toys in New York, the 11 will visit Boston, Baltimore, Philadelphia, Washington, Chicago, Cleveland, Cincinnati, Milwaukee, St. Louis, Kansas City, and possibly Los Angeles and San Francisco.
