British Like Breakfast Foods.
LONDON, (AP)—England is to be introduced to breakfast foods in various forms of wheat. A company has been formed to make the breakfast foods from wheat grown in England. At present such breakfast foods are almost entirely imported from Canada with a small percentage coming from the United States.
The new factory will produce foods for consumption in Great Britain and the continent, where the sale of this type of breakfast food is increasing rapidly.

MANY CARS IN OREGON NOW

A statement of the registration of motor vehicles of other states while in Oregon between May 24 and November 20, 1923, just compiled by Secretary of State, Sam A. Rogers, shows that during that period 29,955 motor cars were granted visitors permits. From May 24th to July 26th there were 12,557 registrations; in August, 12,131; in September, 7,049; in October, 5,741 and in November, 2,777 registrations. Assuming that there was an average of three persons in each car registered, the number of persons visiting Oregon during the registration period would be at least 120,000, which indicates, to some extent, the people of other states and countries who are interested enough in Oregon and her resources and natural wonders to at least pay a visit. Adding to this number those coming into the State by rail and water transportation and those by motor car, the total number of persons who visited Oregon prior to the registration law becoming effective and those during the period of registration who failed to register, it is reasonably safe to assume that between 400,000 and 500,000 persons have visited Oregon for longer or shorter stays so far during the year 1923. A number equal to one half of the present population of the state.

Of those who came in by motor cars the greatest number of registrations were made at the Medford station, Portland was second, Ashland third and Salem fourth. Many of the stations where a lesser number of registrations were made are open only for a portion of the year and in some instances are located on some of the minor highways where travel is not so heavy as on the Pacific Highway where the main registration stations are located.

The following statement shows the number of cars from other states and countries registered in Oregon since May 24, 1923:

A statement of the number of permits issued at the various registration stations shows the following:

Albany, 50; Ashland, 5,774; Astoria, 54; Baker, 236; Bend, 115; Eugene, 584; Gold Beach, 225; Grants Pass, 2,098; Klamath Falls, 582; Medford, 7,774; Ontario, 3,630; Pendleton, 2,751; Portland, 7,281; Salem, 5,485; The Dalles, 1,427; Inspectors, 759.

Many cars licensed under the laws of other states have been, after coming into Oregon, purchased by residents of this State or the owners of such cars have moved up their residence in Oregon after a brief sojourn here. 1,099 cars, which were originally licensed under the laws of other states during the year 1923, have since been registered and licensed in Oregon from which the total license fees aggregate \$9,192. This evidences the beneficial results of a law requiring the non-resident motorist to register his car immediately upon his coming into the state whether to reside temporarily or later to take up his permanent residence therein.

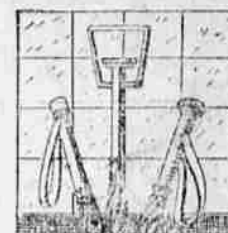

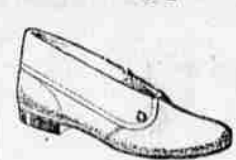
