Driven from Paris Streets

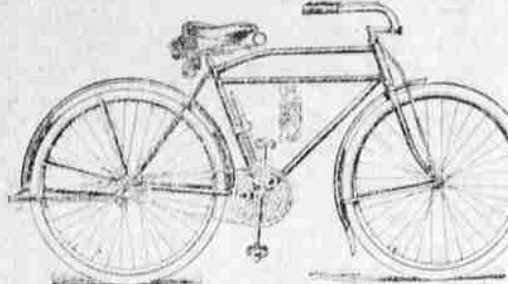

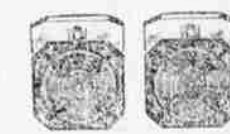
