MELLON GIVES TAX PROGRAM

Secretary Mellon today at the treasury, noted that the reduction program appears to have met with a most favorable public reaction and advised the addition of seven of the committee that treasury officials are prepared to present of any time arguments in support of the proposed revision. In an analysis of the changes proposed, Mr. Mellon placed first the 25 per cent reduction on incomes below \$4,000 and the additional credit of 25 per cent to be granted on earned incomes, showing that in the case of earned incomes of \$4,000 or less the reduction contemplated really amounts to about 48 per cent.
