In re resignation of Hugh McCall as County Treasurer: Resignation accepted and to take effect at once.

In re appointment of a County Treasurer: Florence Bacon appointed Treasurer, appointed to take effect upon the filing of an approved bond.

In re payment of road funds due city of La. Grande: Check directed to draw warrant on General Road Fund in favor of city of La. Grande in the sum of \$1,525.25 for last half 1932 road tax and \$2500.00 payment on amount due city for previous years.

In re transfer of funds from the General Fund to the Road Bond Interest Fund: Treasurer directed to transfer the sum of \$671.53 from the General Fund to the Road Bond Interest Fund to make up deficiency for amount due on Road Bonds as interest.

In re ratification of the action of County Treasurer in transfer-

ing the sum of \$16,000.00 from the General Road Fund to the Market Road Fund; Treasurer's action notified; funds to be returned to the General Road Fund when last half of 1923 Market Road Funds are received from the State.

In re the report of the Assessor of exemptions claimed under the provisions of Chap. 156 Laws 1923; Report approved and exemptions allowed.

In re auditing the records of the various County Officials for 1922; Bill of C. P. Newlin in sum of \$539.00 accepted.

In re approval of the bond of the County Treasurer; Bond approved.

In re appropriation to County Judges & Commissioners' Association; Clerk directed to draw warrant on the General Fund in favor of H. K. Hasbrouck, Secretary-Treasurer of said association, for the salary of Gladys Leonard for assistance as County Aid; Allowed in the sum of \$20.00 per month until further orders.
