

WOOD DEMAND ENCOURAGING

WALLOWA — (SPECIAL)—The demand for dry wood has been very great here since the color weather has set in. Wood cut from seasoned trees, or green cut wood well dried, is finding ready sale at \$2.00 per cord. The wood trade appears much better than at this time last year. A year ago the best price obtainable for the very best grade of wood was only \$2.50 per cord. Very few men in the business felt they could afford to cut wood, and haul it for a distance of several miles and sell at this figure. Consequently many who had in the past sold a good deal of wood did not cut more than what was needed for their own use.

The fall season has been all covered with a light blanket of snow giving much protection from freezing weather. John H. OREGON PHEASANTS 10,000 PHEASANTS

BOZEMAN, Ore. (AP)—More than 10,000 Chinese pheasants were released for hunters of Oregon during the last year, according to a report statement of the Oregon State Game commission, following a check of the reports of the state game warden here and at Corvallis for 1923. The number is a record for the state and the commission believes it has all been supplied by one sale.

It is estimated that Chinese pheasants turned to per cent of the limited bird hunting in Oregon and on an increased program of propagation has the approval of the department. The warden has followed a policy of keeping pheasants from being sold to the public, but the warden has been successful in the past.

The Tahitians were a distinctive people. But virtually all memory of traditions and pride of ancestry have gone, along with their primitive art, their ancient costume, the beauty of their choral music and even the purity of their soft language.

The young Tahitian seeks to be a white man—with indifferent apathy. He has lost his personality. Today he is amused by third-rate motion pictures, jazz and the pleasures of the rum bottle.

Tahiti once held one of the most virile races. In ancient times they were hardly inferior to their exploits as explorers into unknown seas have seldom been equaled in history.

Scientists say that the Tahitians, as a pure race, are doomed. The prediction is made that in half a century they will have vanished from the earth.

HARRISBURG, (AP)—In an effort to reduce the number of accidents to pedestrians on the public highways of this state, the Pennsylvania Motor Federation is urging publicity for the recommendation of the American Automobile association that persons on the highway, especially at night, face the traffic by walking or the left hand side of the road. The national association has reached the conclusion, after a study of the situation, that most of the cases when a pedestrian is struck by a car, are due to the driver being misled by the headlights of approaching cars and, assuming to the right, failing to see pedestrians. It is contended that if the party

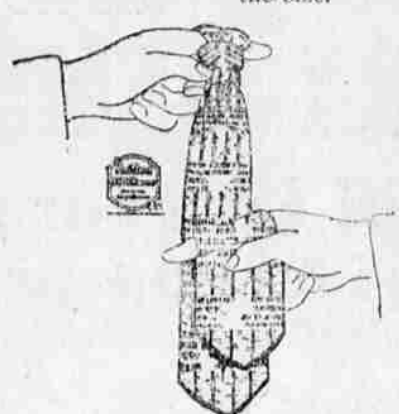
