RUSSIAN CHURCH IS FALLING TO RULE OF TIKHON

MOSCOW. (AP) — Within six months of his release from prison pending trial, Patriarch Tikhon, who was deposed and deprived of his priesthood by the new church authorities, has so far succeeded in regaining control of the church that the clergymen who unfrocked him are now making every effort to effect a compromise with him.

The new Holy Synod has called an 20th Russian Church Council for January 15th and has invited Tikhon to appear before it. Arch-bishop Evdokim, head of the Synod, admitted in a conversation with the correspondent that the conference may never be held if Tikhon declines to attend. The new church group insists that it was legally and canonically correct in deposing and unfrocking the patriarch, and contends that sooner or later the Soviet government will bring the patriarch to trial.

If the church council does not meet, it is expected to reveal deep rifts of petty differences and acrimonious bitter feuds that have developed within the various new church movements during the past year. One group wishes to unfrock Archbishop Evdokim, the Archbishop of Moscow and head of the Church of the Resurrection movement. Another group is said to be very anxious to attack Archbishop Evdokim, the fiery orator who headed the previous church council in its denunciation of Tikhon.

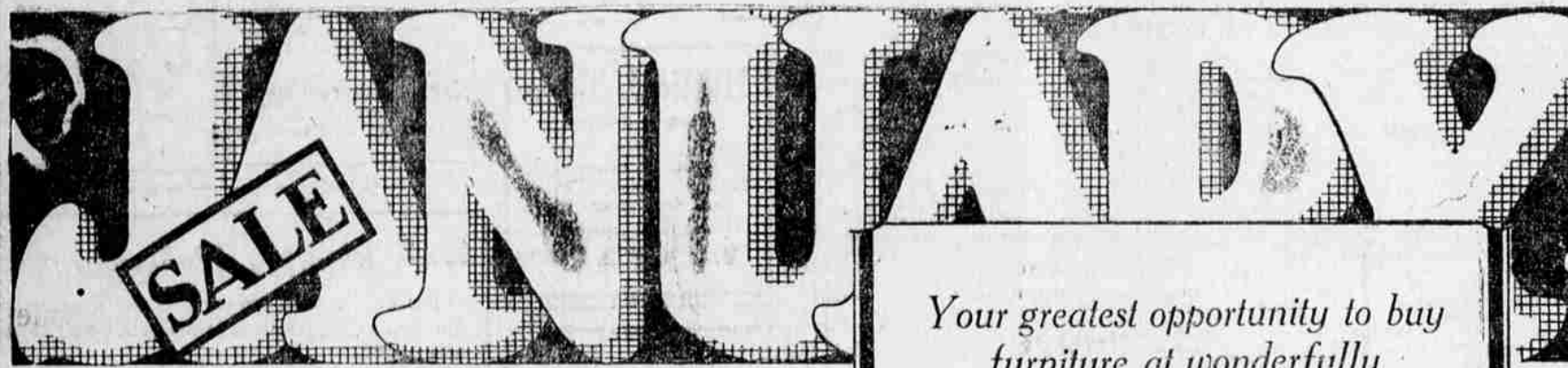
Those made of gold and silver lace, chiffon and delicate lace are the most popular.
