CHILDBIRTH RATE OF DEATH IS AT VERY LOW POINT
WASHINGTON (AP)—Last year's death rate of mothers from childbirth or puerperal causes was lower than for any year since 1916. The ratio of deaths from childbirth to the number of women bearing children in 1922 was 1 to 150.

In the birth registration act of the census bureau, comprising 30 states and the District of Columbia, the death rate last year was 6.6 per 1,000 live births, compared with 6.5 in 1921; 5.6 in 1920; 7.7 in 1919; 9.1 in 1918; 6.2 in 1917; 6.2 in 1916; and 6.1 in 1915. The relatively high rates for the years 1920, 1919 and 1918 were doubtless due, for the most part at least, to the epidemic of influenza which prevailed in those years and took a heavy toll of prospective mothers.

In the 76 states, Puerto Rico and the District of Columbia, the death rate was 16.7 per 1,000 live births, and Minnesota the lowest with 4.9.

ALL OF HER SONS DIED OF VIOLENCE
SYRACUSE, N. Y. (INS)—Married four times and all of her sons the victims of violent deaths before they reached the age of 25—this was the tragic story told by the judicial settlement of the \$25,000 estate of Mrs. Frances E. Sinclair, of Skaneateles.

Mrs. Sinclair, it was revealed, was first married to William Cole, who died soon after their marriage leaving her with one child, William. Her second husband was Nathaniel Hunter, whose wife had died leaving him a son, Austin. The second husband died.

Austin Hunter, son of Nathaniel Hunter, was killed later in a riot at Denver, Col. Mrs. Hunter's son William, her second husband, was shot and killed from the results of a wound suffered while he was using a scythe.

Dwight Hunter, her own son by Hunter, was found dead in a barn with a bullet through his head. Charles Hunter stood before a mirror in his bedroom and saw a bullet into his brain. All of the children died before they had reached the age of 25.

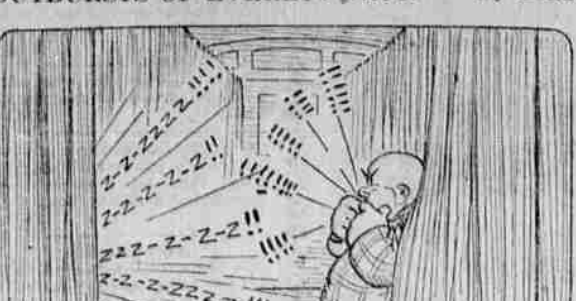

NEGROES ARE MOVING NORTH

Census Bureau Proves Fact That Colored Population Quitting Southern Climes.

WASHINGTON (AP)—The center of negro population in the United States has been determined by the Census Bureau as 1.5 miles northeast of Rising Fawn, in DeKalb County, Georgia. For the first time in history this center has moved to the northeast, its former movement having been in a southeasterly direction.

The movement of the center of negro population is an accurate index of the direction of negro migration," says the bureau. "In 1790 it was located 25 miles southwest of Petersburg, Va. In 1850 it was located 104 miles east of Lafayette, Georgia. From 1850 to 1890 the southeasterly movement was continued and it advanced 29.1 miles to a point 16.5 miles southwest of Lafayette, and about 10 miles east of the Alabama line, 4 miles east of the Alabama line, west 463 miles, an average of 46 miles each decade. From 1890 to 1900 its movement was greatly retarded, and it advanced only 9.1 miles, across the Alabama-Georgia line to 16.7 miles northeast of Port

Payne, Alabama, about 1 mile west of the Georgia line. In 1910 it was located 5.4 miles north-northeast of Port Payne, its movement for the decade being 6 miles west-southwest. Its movement south was evidently greatly retarded by the migration of negroes to the northern and eastern states. In 1920 it moved back across the state line into Georgia and was located 1.5 miles north-northeast of Rising Fawn, DeKalb County, Georgia, having moved 21.6 miles.

"The present northeasterly movement was due principally to the great increase in the negro population of Massachusetts, Connecticut, New York, New Jersey, Pennsylvania, West Virginia, Ohio, Indiana and Michigan. The total increase in the negro population of the United States was 475,245, and the increase in the northern states noted was 56 per cent of the total increase. This began north of the negro population was due mainly to the expansion of certain industries during the World war, the high wages paid being the great attraction. It is probably true that this movement has been continued.
