Rules Governing Prize Money in Power Boat Race Changed

DETROIT (AP) - Revision of the rules governing the International Sweepstakes Power Boat race, designed to obviate the controversy that characterized the first race run here last Labor day, has been adopted by the executive committee of the Yachtmen's Association of America.

The most important changes made in the rules concern the prize money. The \$25,000 prize is abolished, and in its place the committee decided to award an elaborate trophy to the winner and evenly pro-rate \$5,000 among all boats finishing the race.

Following the business meeting of two organizations, they will join in a feed, consisting of doughnuts, coffee and apples.

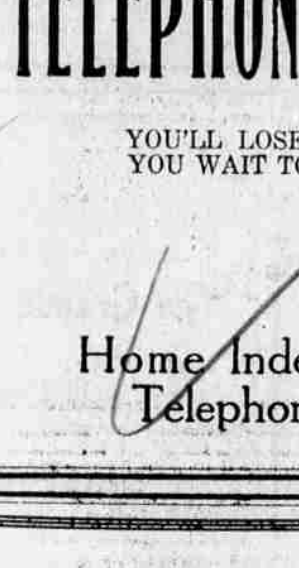
