Income Tax Tips

Beginning this week, the Evening Observer will print a series of explanations regarding the federal income tax provisions for the benefit of the newspaper's readers.

Below, preceding the first article in the series, is given the "income tax in a nutshell."

WHO? Single persons who had net income of \$1,000 or more or gross income of \$5,000 or more; and married couples who had net income of \$2,000 or more or gross income of \$5,000 or more must file returns.

WHEN? The filing period is from January 1 to March 15, 1924.

WHERE? Collector of internal revenue for the district in which the person lives or has his principal place of business.

HOW? Instructions on Form 1040A and 1040; also the law and regulations.

WHAT? Four per cent normal tax on the first \$4,000 of net income in excess of the personal exemption and credits for dependents. Eight per cent normal tax on balance of net income. Surplus from 1 per cent to 50 per cent on net incomes over \$6,000 for the year 1923.

It appeared that little prospect of breaking the deadlock existed.

The house program of the day is one of oratory. Upshaw, Democrat of Georgia, demanded drastic action to stop alleged liquor drinking by members of Congress and to prevent leakage of "diplomatic liquor."

Upshaw said that Congress should "clean around its own door" by passing a resolution declaring persons non grata to the floor of the house to any member found under the influence of liquor in the person lives or has his principal place of business.

German Kills Self Rather Than Share Home as Law Director

TRIPPOW, Germany, (AP) — Paul Nickel, formerly chief of the local board of Tripow, killed himself rather than surrender two rooms of his dwelling to a family with many children, in accordance with an order of the housing committee.

Nickel, who was 70 years old, had resisted the commandeering of his rooms, but when it became evident that he would lose the case and be forced to share his home with strangers, he shot himself.

This did not kill him, so he hanged himself, leaving a letter saying he could not bear to have part of his home taken from him.

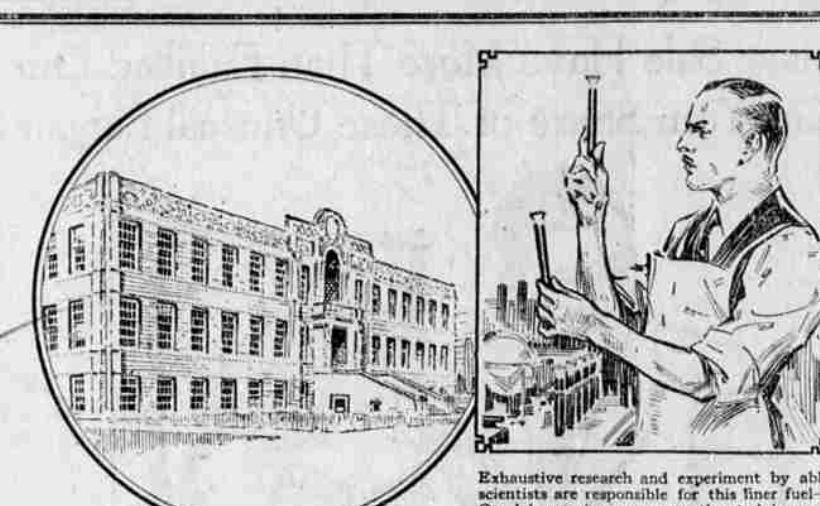
