Cherries Showing Broken Wing for the Last Time Today.

When you see a picture uncertain, as amusing and as thrilling as "The Broken Wing," the Preferred Picture adapted from the Dickey-Goddard play which opened last night at the Cherry Theatre, you are apt to wonder just what quality it is that distinguishes it from the usual type of film offering.

In this instance we are convinced that the success of "The Broken Wing" is not dependent upon a single element but upon that combination so seldom arrived at in producing a motion picture. In the first place, B. P. Schubert, who personally supervised its making, secured a play which offered every possibility for filming—humor, excitement, atmosphere. Then he entrusted its direction to Tom Forman whom we have felt we can depend upon ever since he turned out "Shadows," a picture that is

classed with the year's best. Perhaps "The Broken Wing" owes a good deal of its excellence to the fact that Tom Forman has stamped his own personality on the screen version, choosing the necessary locations himself, undertaking the direction and supervising the editing.

Comedy showing, "Play Up," "Salomy Jane" Cast Is Composed of Stars—Opening At Arcade Tuesday.

Some of the most talented and widely known players on the screen appear in Paramount's new picture, "Salomy Jane," a George Melford production based on the famous story by Bret Harte, which will be the feature at the Arcade Theatre for two days, beginning Tuesday.

Jacqueline Logan, a former Edison girl, plays the main role. Her role of the great out-of-control woman is particularly adapted here for the photoplay of pioneer life in California in the days of '49. Many human touches of quaint humor are woven into the fabric of this romantic screen play by George Pawcett, who plays the role of "Yuba Bill," a stage coach driver.

Maurice Flynn, Yale graduate and college athlete, takes the part of "The Man," a stranger in the little mining settlement whose mission is unknown and who in a scene of gripping tragedy becomes the sweetheart of Salomy Jane.

"The Man" is accused of holding up the stage coach and is about to be led away to be hanged by the Vigilantes when Salomy Jane, moved by a strange impulse, saves him good-bye. Red Peter, proven to be one of the holdup men, is hanged by the stranger's escape on returning to thank Salomy for her kindness, he meets an old friend, Holdwin.

In the fight, Baldwin is shot from ambush by another man. Salomy lends the stranger some of her father's clothes that he may get out of the country. This leads Larabee, an enemy of Salomy Jane's father, to shoot at the stranger. Larabee is killed by a bullet from the stranger's rifle. As he dies, he confesses that Baldwin, now dead, was Red Peter's partner in the stage robbery.

The action is swift from start to finish. The supporting cast is excellent and includes such favorites as Charles Ogle, Louise Dresser, James Neil and Clarence Burton. A comedy will also be shown.

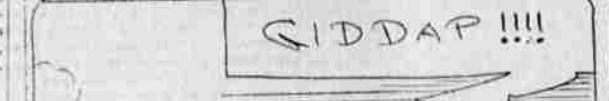

Income Tax Tips

No. 3. The income tax is imposed upon net income, which is gross income less certain specified deductions for business expenses, etc. To be fully explained later. The normal tax rate is 1 per cent on the first \$4,000 of net income in excess of the exemptions and credits and 8 per cent on the remaining net income. Surtax rates, which apply only to net income in excess of \$6,000, range from 1 per cent on the amount between \$6,000 and \$10,000 to 50 per cent on the amount by which the net income exceeds \$24,000.

Single persons in calculating the normal tax may subtract from net income an exemption of \$1,000. The exemptions for married persons and heads of families are \$2,000 on incomes of \$5,000 or less and \$2,000 on incomes in excess of \$5,000. Taxpayers are allowed also an additional credit of \$100 for each person (other than husband or wife) dependent upon and receiving his chief support from the taxpayer. If such dependent person is under 18 years of age or incapable of self-support because mentally or physically defective.

In the case of married persons, a joint return reporting the income of both may be filed, or separate returns may be filed showing the income of each. If their combined net income is subject to the surtax, a married couple will pay a smaller tax by filing separate returns. For example, a husband's net income for 1923 was \$7,000 and the wife's \$6,000. If a joint return is filed, the income is subject to a

of 1 per cent on the amount of net income between \$6,000 and \$10,000, or 44. If separate returns are filed, the husband's surtax is 1 per cent on the amount of his net income between \$6,000 and \$7,000, or \$10. The wife having a net income of less than \$6,000 pays no surtax.

In filing separate returns either husband or wife, but not both, may claim the personal exemption, or it may be divided between them in such amounts as they desire.
