Dr. Landrith Speaks At Endeavor Rally (Continued from page 1)

long line of captains of industry and labor to the highest man who reads and thinks intelligently, and the universal answer to the heart-breaking question, "What does mankind most need?" is "Pure religion and undefiled." Harding died with the words on his lips. Woodrow Wilson came back from the brink of his own grave to write almost these same words. All the rest of us believe it, when we do ourselves the honor to think at all. A thousand ques-

tions filled with salvation or ruin no other way sanely and safely in no other way than by the sermon on the Mount. International relations, never so chaotic and threatening as now, will snap under the strain of wars unless the idealism of the Great Peace-maker can be substituted for feuding partisan-ship and unholy greed.

"Tactical, partisan, national, sectional and sectarian prejudices abound; and on these airings the soldiers need in harmony, good will, brotherly love—local, state, national, world-wide brotherly love. Fifteen million graves on battle fields, none of those graves ten years old, and nearly every one of them the grave of youth that was denied the inherent right of youth to live for his country—all those mock us as we fiddle over whether we shall stop war or start another; whether we shall stand for the pound of flesh that may be our due, or stand together to save all flesh from the vulture of world annihilation. Meanwhile from Washington to London and Brussels and Paris, we fiddle!"

"Laws are passed solemnly and by overwhelming majorities in a republic that spent fabulous treasure and uncountable worth of its best young manhood to give other nations 'self determination,' and countless thousands who call them selves good citizens, flout and disregard these laws and seek office that they may better serve the criminals who disobey them and trample the constitution of the nation that boasts that it saved the world from autocracy. And officers fiddle in the presence of this holocaust of lawless orgy."

"What is the remedy for all this and a hundred similar ills? The training of a single generation of young people to think right and do right and be right because they believe in and serve Jesus Christ."

"But this sounds like cant," say fiddlers, and even in the church they go on with their divisions, proposing one scheme rather than healing those that should never have been. Aton some doctrinaire arises and proposed the further separation of the churches already made feeble by sectarian strife; or offers to destroy some religion for training Christian youth because he did not invent it; or, in any of a multitude of hateful ways, declaim the strength of the Church's heroic bearers of burdens, by appealing to prejudice or some other form of—just fiddling."

"Meanwhile there has grown up in the world, for such a time as this, an inter-racial, inter-denominational, inter-national and wholly non-partisan, because Christlike movement called "Christian Endeavor" that stands always and only for what this sick and dying world so sorely needs. Quietly, unheralded, without the aid of vast wealth or influence, it has made its appeal to all classes and churches and in all nations until in this desperate hour it offers to the world four-million active members, in 50,000 organizations and under every flag, to help to bring the race back to the only normalcy there is worth while—good will and saving faith in God."

"Through 42 years it has trained at its altars no less than 20,000 children and youth to fear only God and hate only sin, and under the wisest Christian statesmanship it is now leading these young people, and advising the millions of adults, to the service of the larger service of the church, to become 'friends of Christ' because as 'friends in Christ' they have won 'friends for Christ.'"

At length Dr. Landrith explained how Christian Endeavor has helped already to bring about a better inter-churchness, a more cordial inter-denominational, a closer friendship among unfriendly races and nations, and how it has succeeded in making its members better citizens than partisans; and then he urged universal acceptance and support of the movement to the end that it may multiply its usefulness everywhere since, in his judgment, it has "come to the Kingdom for such a time as this."

and \$8000 to \$5000 under existing law. The rate would increase progressively to a maximum of 44 per cent on incomes of \$52,000 and more, as compared with the Mellon proposal for a maximum of 25 per cent on incomes in excess of \$100,000, and the present maximum of 50 per cent on incomes of more than \$200,000.

Raising Exemptions Proposed. Increase the exemption of the head of a family from \$2500 to \$3000 and for a single person

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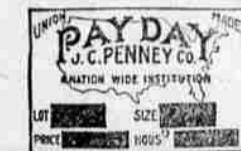
