WALLOWA, Or.—The Bowman-Hicks Lumber company started an extra shift in the sawmill here recently. The night force is made up of 20 men, most of whom reside in this locality. No changes were made in the force in the La Grande plant.

This makes the payroll of the local concern number a hundred and forty-two. Twenty-five of this number are employed in the planing and shipping department, and a like number in the day shift of the saw mill.

The new shift goes on at 5 p. m. and works until 1:30 in the morning. Lights have been strung up in the yard, and saws are buzzing along busily. A. C. Martin is the foreman in charge of the night shift.

With the new shift in operation it is expected that the output of the local mill will average a hundred thousand board feet a day. The logs are coming in rapidly, and the pond is full, and the logs are banked around the sides. The increased activity of the mill means much to the
