JOE THOMAS MUST SERVE TERM IN JAIL

would be in want for provisions if he was incarcerated, Eugene Ashwell, local attorney, presented the petitioner's claims and called upon R. J. Kitcher to substantiate the facts of the case.

But another element came into the controversy that was totally unexpected and that resulted in thoroughly convincing the commissioners that Thomas was aware that he was committing a crime and was not so ignorant as his petition would seem to indicate. City Manager Hayes stated that at a later date, evidences were found in the sewer near Thomas' place, which is near the courthouse, that Thomas had operated a still in a sewer manhole hidden from sight and also stated that Thomas had attempted to destroy it following his conviction.

It is expected that Thomas will be placed behind the bars today.

Salary List Passed
Last evening the salary ordinance for the year was read for the third time and adopted. Salaries of city officers and employees were set at the following amounts: City manager \$300; city judge \$50; city recorder \$160; treasurer \$125; attorney \$75; deputy attorney \$50; physician \$15; chief of police \$120; regular policeman \$120; fire department chief \$140; fireman \$120; street and water superintendent \$140; stenographer \$90; band leader \$50; janitor \$30; boy or creek pipeline caretaker \$100.

The above amounts all apply to one month's salary.

E. R. Kings, local attorney, appeared on behalf of Mrs. Hartley, who conducts a rooming house on Depot street and whose right to a license was questioned last week by the commission. It was accused of the violation of the ordinance by Mrs. Hartley, who was in the rooming house and that Mrs. Hartley was aware of the fact. Due to the belief that Mrs. Hartley misrepresented her rights as proprietor of the rooming house, the action of revoking the license was suspended but Mrs. Hartley was placed under probation at the same time. Unless further manifestation of offenses against city ordinance result in the rooming house, Mrs. Hartley will be permitted to conduct the business with the sanction of the city official.

Improvement district No. 135, created some time ago, was advanced to the point of advertising for bids to be received by the commissioners on Wednesday, January 23. Last night was the time for the hearing of objections, objections and claims of irregularities on the improvement, but as none were entered the district was put through in short order. The district deals with a portion of M avenue.

The monthly report of the city treasurer, the weekly report of the city manager and the yearly report of the fire department were read and approved.

A petition from property owners on Fourth street concerning the proposed erection of a morgue in proximity to their properties was read. No action was taken last evening but the matter was referred to the city attorney to investigate the city's rights in the matter.

Faded Debs Bewail Apathetic Society

PHILADELPHIA. — Philadelphia debutantes of last season's vintage, rebuffed by declining matrimony, are fighting for dear recognition. The "debs" would continue to be blooming buds, pervading ballrooms with the fragrance of youth, instead of being wallflowers that merely decorate for that reason they have denounced as "arrest and inhuman" the widespread custom of hostesses giving "second year girls" the go-by courteous in order to devote themselves to the blooming of the latest buds.

The condition up to the present has been accepted, socially, as a sort of necessary evil, but the action of a mother of a popular debutante has brought the question of "shelving or no shelving out into the open."

"I've sent my little girl to school during this winter and recently," in order that she may escape the cruelty of this first flat year out.

Other mothers are able to sympathize with her, and an association for the prevention of social cruelty to debutantes looms on society's horizon here.

Two factors are blamed for the condition—the scarcity of men and the large social group to be considered, the latter involving, in a casual monetary way, the expense of launching the flimsy craft of matrimony. One matron estimated that it had cost \$100,000 over a period of five months to bring out her daughter in the accepted way. Single parties, she said, often entailed bidding over-riding adieu to \$10,000 and \$15,000.
