CONVENTION OPENS TODAY

Eighty High Schools of Oregon Represented at University of Oregon Caucus in Eugene.

EUGENE, (Special)—Eighty high schools will send delegates to the annual conference of the state High School Association of Student Body Officers and the High School Press Association, to be held at the University of Oregon, today and Saturday.

The high schools of the Willamette Valley, southern Oregon, Portland, and a number of eastern Oregon communities will be represented by student body presidents, editors of newspapers, magazines and annuals, and presidents of "circle" groups. Eastern and central Oregon delegates which will send delegates include Madras, Prineville, Pass, Wasco, Hood River, Redmond, The Dalles, La Grande, Antelope, and Moro, Merrill, near the northern California line, in the extreme southern Oregon community which plans to participate in the conference.

Gov. Walter M. Pierce will address the delegates Saturday afternoon on "Law Enforcement."

A. C. Strange, superintendent of Astoria schools and president of the Oregon State Teachers' Association; C. A. Howard, superintendent of Marshfield schools; David J. Jones, principal of Eugene high school, Dean H. D. Sheldon of the University school of education, and President P. L. Campbell are included on the program for student body officers.

Dean John Straub, "the grand old man" of the University who has been with the institution for forty-five years, will make his first public address since his recent illness when he appears before the high school delegates at the Friday evening banquet.

Fred Bonit, editor of the Portland News, and Hal E. Hovey, president of the State Editorial Association will speak to the high school editors and managers. Mr. Bonit's subject is, "The Feature Element in the News." Mr. Hovey speaks on "How to Edit an Annual."

The high school journalism efficiency contests have aroused keen interest. Winners will be announced Saturday afternoon.

KOREA DAMAGED BY WAVES AND FLOODS

NEW YORK, (AP)—Reports received by the Presbyterian Board of Missions from missionaries in Korea show that that country suffered heavy damaging during the latter part of 1923 from floods and tidal waves. A large part of the country was inundated and thousands of homes were swept away.

The regions outside the submerged sections were visited by storms which caused the total destruction of rice fields, and these did not yield a grain of food.

An added destructive force was a giant tidal wave, which surged inland and swallowed up entire villages. It swept large boats into village streets and cut a new beach line 50 to 100 feet further inland from the original shore line, the new line standing straight up like palm trees.

Many Presbyterian churches were washed away and others collapsed after being weakened by the floods and storms.
