## STEAMERS START "MAGELLAN TRIP" EACH FORTNIGHT

SAN FRANCISCO (AP).—Modern Magellans today can start twice a month on the voyage that the early Portuguese navigator found so difficult and perilous, for the Dollar Steamship company has an around-the-world service with fortnightly sailings.

Encircling the globe apparently has lost none of its interest for the traveler, if it has become a commonplace of modern navigation, and on this theory Captain Robert Dollar, meteoric figure of the maritime world, has begun in his eighth year the first such regular passenger service in history. There have been occasional world tours, but never a schedule as periodic as the sailings between New York and Southampton.

A fleet of seven liners, built by the American government and leased from the shipping board, will be used for the world travelers. With the steamship President Harrison sailing from San Francisco on the inaugural voyage January 5, the company's list called for a sailing every two weeks, after February 7, from New York, Boston, Los Angeles and San Francisco. The ships rounding the planet will call at 21 ports in 112 days. Passengers will have stop-over privileges, with the opportunity to resume the voyage on a sister ship. The President Adams will make the first sailing from New York on February 7.

Ports of call include Havana, Colon, Balboa, Honolulu, Kobe, Shanghai, Hongkong, Manila, Singapore, Penang, Colombo, Port Said, Alexandria, Genoa and Marseilles.

A national delegation of trade envoys, representing the leading commercial centers of the United States, will make the initial voyage on the President Harrison. The San Francisco Chamber of Commerce is managing this feature, which is prompted by the opportunity to advance the interests of the American merchant marines.

Other liners in the around-the-world service are the President Hayes, President Garfield, President Polk, President Monroe and President Van Buren. The vessels are of identical dimensions—522 feet in length, with 62 feet of beam and a displacement tonnage of 21,000—and have been equipped similarly.

**Hiker Disproves Old Idea That Australia is Mostly Waste Land**  
SYDNEY, N. S. W. (AP).—Edward A. Cook recently completed a leisure stroll of more than 2000 miles, as the crow flies, from Melbourne to Darwin in the north of Australia. His object was to make an examination of mid-Australia and the northern territory to substantiate his contention that those sections were not worthless wastes. He took more than 300 pictures of scenes along the route.

Speaking of his experience with natives in northern Australia he said they appeared to be of a better class than those of the south. "The territory is full of surprises from the pastoral viewpoint," said Mr. Cook, "being well watered and substantially grassed and timbered. Free from droughts, the much maligned north country must soon come into its own."

## Wieringen Children Were Dutch Tutors To Ex-Crown Prince

WIERINGEN, Holland. (AP).—Children of the fishermen of the island of Wieringen were the chief companions of ex-Crown Prince William, of Germany, during his stay here after the revolution. When the former prince was not making horsebores, one of his favorite forms of exercise or reading, he was strolling about the fields or along the wharfs with his pals, the youngsters. It was from the children, chiefly, that William learned to speak Dutch fluently.

"My best helpers in picking up the language were the children of the fishermen," the ex-prince said just before his departure to join his family at his castle at Oels, Silesia. "The children were not shy like the old folks, some of whom often were awed by my presence, and just as natural as could be. I played with the boys and girls, held the little ones some times on my knee, drew for them pictures of animals, and houses and trees and even sketched some of the most picturesque children themselves and gave them the results of my drawings."

"By association with the children I learned the language better and easier than if I had devoted all my time to studying books and papers. The brain of a normal youngster is the most curious thing in the world. The best system for an adult to learn another language is to talk regularly with children about nature and about books and pictures. Children just naturally are interested in everything."

William, who is 45, has six children of his own, the eldest being 18.

## Medicos See Perils In Pipestem Forms

LONDON, (I.N.S.)—Famous doctors and nerve specialists have begun a protest against the practices adopted by many young women and girls in order to reduce and bring their figures into line with the "pipestem" figure now fashionable, which demands the complete obliteration of curves and a straight, unbroken line from neck to knee.

Many girls swallow their bodies in a tight tightness only intended to mimic wrappings, while some even bandage their bodies in strips of sticking plaster tightly wound, allege the doctors.

"This is a thousand times worse than the old tight-lacing," say the medicals. "Breathing becomes difficult under such intense pressure, and the lungs are cramped. In the tight-lacing days only a part of the body was cramped, but now these women and girls place abnormal pressure on the stomach and chest organs."
