JOURNEY'S AIM IS RARE GAME

Explorer Embarks on a Long Trip with Rare Animals as His Objective.

NEW YORK (AP)—Colonel J. C. Fauntleroy, big game hunter and explorer, at one time attached to the British Embassy at Washington, will leave New York within the week on the first leg of a several thousand mile journey in search of a pink-headed duck, a rhinoceros deer, the rare Indian buffalo and the almost extinct Indian lion.

The trip will be a continuation of an expedition begun a year ago and is designed to complete the American Museum of Natural History in New York. If the hunters have the game they seek, or any part of it, in addition to the collection already mounted in the American Museum will make that exhibit the finest and most complete Indian collection in the world, Colonel Fauntleroy said.

To achieve its purpose the expedition must labor through many weary months and miles of jungles, forests, and mountains, through French Indo-China, the little-known Taik Plateau and the wild Indian province of Jungkaha.

Colonel Fauntleroy will go directly to Calcutta, where in March he will join the main body of the expedition, headed by Arthur H. Verax, also a Britisher, but for many years a New York importer. Mr. Verax is financing the expedition party.

Colonel Fauntleroy spent many years in the British Indian civil service and returned to England for the world war, after which he was at Washington. He made his

Chicago's Business Blocks Most Costly In the United States

CHICAGO (AP)—"Spotless Town" in America in St. Paul, Minn., according to a survey completed here by the National Association of Building Owners and Managers. The survey, compiled in the annual accounting and exchange report of the association, covering an analysis of operating expenses, rental income and investment factors in office buildings in the principal cities of the United States, also revealed that Pittsburgh building managers have a harder time keeping their buildings clean than in any other city.

For St. Paul the report showed that it required only 47 working days a year to keep each 1,000 feet of office building space in order and to provide elevator service, heat, janitor service and repairs. In Pittsburgh, 182 days a year were required for each 1,000 square feet of office space. The nation's capital, Washington, was next with a requirement of 162 days of labor for each 1,000 square feet of floor space.

In point of cost Pittsburgh was highest with a charge of 29.8 cents a square foot and Chicago next highest with a charge of 24 cents a square foot.

An extensive analysis of the investment feature of office buildings also was made in the report, revealing that the land under Chicago's buildings was rated at a higher value a square foot than the land in any other city, as well as having the most expensive buildings. From the standpoint of efficiency and of construction, Seattle topped the list with an average for the 15 buildings reporting of the city of 78.5 per cent of the lot area actually used.

GREB WINNER OVER WILSON

Middleweight Champion Defends Title Successfully—Herman and McAuliffe Fight Draw.

NEW YORK (AP)—Harry Greb of Pittsburg, successfully defended his world's middleweight boxing title Friday night against Johnny Wilson of Boston, former titleholder, receiving the judges' decision at the end of a 15-round contest at Madison Square Garden.

Jack McAuliffe II, of Detroit and Tiny Herman of Omaha, boxed six rounds to a draw Friday night preceding the Greb-Wilson middleweight championship fight. Herman weighed 217 pounds and McAuliffe 204.

Fight by Rounds.
In the first round Greb jumped to the attack, landing a swinging left to the body. They worked at long range with little effect. Greb kept hooking the left to Wilson's body and Wilson was unable to land a blow.
Round 2—They engaged in an exchange of body punching at close quarters. Greb missed a long hook and was sent to the ropes from a stiff left to the stomach. He recovered quickly, however, and they began slugging. Greb was hitting often but his blows did not seem to hurt.
Round 3—Greb swung a right to Wilson's stomach during a heavy slugging engagement. Wilson retaliated with a shaking left hook in the jaw. After a bit of milling around, Wilson crashed a right to Greb's jaw and Greb stayed away for the rest of the round.
Wilson Takes Offensive.
Round 4—Wilson rocked Greb with two swinging rights to the body and a left hook to the stomach. They fell into half a dozen clinches after slugging punches and when the referee cautioned Greb to open up, Wilson walked to the middle of the ring and said, "Let's fight," but the round ended.
Round 5—Wilson led another attack to the body. Wilson was landing often now. He kept landing straight lefts into Greb's stomach. Greb began holding. Greb danced around and started a swinging attack but Wilson evaded the hardest swings.
Round 6—They milled each other around but neither was engaged. Wilson sank a left into the stomach that made Greb's head with a straight right. Wilson came back with a two-fisted attack to the body that forced Greb to the ropes.
Round 7—Both missed hard punches and once Wilson, turning all the way around, sent Greb and started towards the side of the ring for him, making the crowd roar. Greb turned Johnny around again with a hard right to the jaw. They exchanged swinging rights to the body and then at close quarters chopped at each other's jaw.
Greb Speaks Up.
Round 8—Greb swung a dozen rights to the head and body. Wilson's head rocked from the impact of straight lefts. Greb was on the offensive. Right uppercuts at close quarters had Wilson's head bobbing up and down. Greb swung a hard right to the stomach at the bell ring.
Round 9—There was a lot of wild swinging by both men. Wilson jarred Greb with a right to the jaw and Greb came back with heavy rights to the body. Greb was landing heavily to the head and body with his right.
Round 10—They milled around for at least a minute before either landed a blow. Greb then swung another right to the body. Greb was now slugging about two or three times a minute, swinging punches from any angle. Greb turned Wilson completely around with a clinch on the jaw and Wilson was bewildered when the bell rang.
Round 11—Greb danced around and about Wilson and at times went around so fast that he hit Wilson three and four times before the challenger would find him again. Wilson sent in an occasional hard left to the body. Wilson's left eye was closing from a swinging right.
Fighters Slow Down.
Round 12—There was hardly any action to speak of. Wilson was cowering about his injured eye and kept rubbing his left eye at long range.

Wilson landed a left hook to the jaw as the round ended.
Round 13—Greb hung lefts at Wilson's head, Wilson countering with short punches to the body. Greb kept slugging a right to the body. There was a lot of clinching and the latter part of the round was slow.
Round 14—Greb kept shooting the right and it was doing great work for him. Greb started milling in close quarters and Wilson's mouth bled. A right uppercut shook Wilson to his heels.
Round 15—Greb slammed a right to the jaw, Wilson coming back with a shaking left to the chin. Greb drove Wilson to the ropes with a swinging attack to the body. There was a lot of head to head milling which seemed to be an even exchange. Greb swung three rights to the body as the fight ended.
