AIRWAY SCHEME IS ABOUT READY TO BE LAUNCHED

LONDON (AP)—The greatest airway scheme yet presented to be launched next year by the economically powerful Trans-Europe Union, four of the seven are German in origin and control, says the Daily Mail air correspondent.

The German companies in this group, which seeks an airway control of Europe, are the Aero-Lloyd, (Lumpen, Junkers and Bayerischer Luft-Lloyd). The three others are the Swiss Aero-Express, the Austrian Oesterreichische Luftverkehr and the Hungarian Aero-Express. This combine, in which the Junkers group predominates, aims at the control of something like 12,000 miles of European airways, stretching from Archangel in the north to Athens and Smyrna in the south.

TO BUILD 30,000 FORDS IN GREAT BRITAIN IN 1924

Manchester plant of the Ford Motor Company of England, Ltd., the largest automobile factory in the British Isles, will produce approximately 30,000 cars during the year 1924, according to a recent report.

The English company, formed in 1919, began operations in a small factory near London where 570 cars were turned out in the first year. The factory was moved shortly afterward to Manchester, forming the nucleus about which the present mammoth plant employing 2,200 men has developed.

While the company was originally dependent on the Ford Motor Company in America for parts, the new plant includes an 800,000 square foot of floor space equipped up-to-date automatic production machinery for every important unit. This the English Ford car, originally a combination of American parts and British assembly, is now 90 per cent British, both in manufacture and materials.

ALAMEDA, CAL. (AP) — William Jones of the city used to earn his living as a painter of houses. One day as he was at work on a house his arms came in contact with a live wire and were burned so badly that it was necessary to amputate them just below the shoulder.

Facing about for a means of livelihood, Jones devised a pair of artificial arms for himself. He found that he could hold a brush and he could draw pretty well and he began experimenting with painting on a small scale. He studied art and tried painting pictures of outdoor scenes. He soon passed the crude stage and his work became vivid. He found that occasionally he could sell a painting and decided to devote his life to the pursuit that had come to fascinate him.

Now many of his pictures of the woods and mountains and water ways of his region find a ready sale, and local critics have encouraged him.

Samoa's Chiefs Fined.

PAPO FAFO, American Samoa, (AP)—Three prominent Samoan chiefs have been found guilty of conspiring to defraud the island revenues, and fined \$200 each. Their sentences were fined \$125 each. The men were tried by a special

high court, presided over by the American judge, Sidney D. Hall, and including five associate judges chosen from the people. Governor Edward S. Kelling, U. S. N., dismissed the chiefs from their official positions.

VIENNA (L.N.S.)—A strike of postal and telegraph workers throughout Austria is threatened because of a governmental inquiry concerning the reduction in the number of officials which requires the heads of departments to ascertain whether the officials under him are inclined to flirt with members of the opposite sex.

STOCKHOLM (AP)—Having spent \$15,000,000 in the last five years in efforts to solve the housing problem in Sweden, the state now finds the situation considerably relieved.
