FREIGHT RATE NOW LOWERED

Public Service Commission Orders Reductions in Oregon From 10 to 40 Per Cent on Produce.

SALEM, Or. (Special)—The Oregon Public Service Commission has issued an order prescribing freight rate reductions ranging from ten to forty per cent on grain products, potatoes and onions on the lines of the principal carriers throughout the state, according to H. H. Corey of the commission.

This order is the result of a general investigation initiated by the Commission in May of last year after hundreds of notices had been sent to commercial organizations, granges and other farm organizations throughout the state. The hearings before the Commission extended over a period of weeks, the last of which ended in October. At these hearings all the principal farm organizations of the state were represented.

The order of the Commission prescribes a maximum, reasonable distance scale to apply jointly and locally on the lines of the carriers involved. This order is a part of the general investigation which resulted in an order of the Commission last month requiring substantial reductions in hay rates.

An important feature of the Commission's order is that it eliminates the differential existing on branch lines and makes one scale of rates apply on all lines. Herebefore, on many as three scales have been in effect on the lines of a single railroad company. The order also establishes joint rates, whereas shippers heretofore have been subjected to the application of a combination of local rates on shipments moving from the lines or one carrier to another.

Corresponding reductions on each commodity between all points within the State have been made the order, in part, reading as follows:

The rate for a distance of five miles and under shall be four cents per one hundred pounds. For each succeeding five miles the rate shall increase not to exceed one-half cent per one hundred pounds up to and including one hundred miles; the rate thereafter shall increase not to exceed one-half cent per one hundred pounds for each ten miles for hauls up to and including four hundred miles, and the rate thereafter shall increase not to exceed one-half cent for each twenty miles to and including six hundred miles.

PER CAPITA TAX IS GIVEN

Tax Collections in 1922 Announced Sunday; Individual Contribution Was \$68.37.

WASHINGTON (AP)—An average of \$68.37 for every man, woman and child in the United States was collected in taxes in 1922 by the national, state, county and city governments and all other civil divisions having power to levy and collect taxes. Taxes collected in that year amounted to \$7,472,081,000, the census bureau announced Sunday.

Taxes collected by the federal government in the fiscal year beginning July 1, 1922, amounted to \$2,614,123,000, which was almost five times the amount collected in 1912. The per capita amount of the government's taxes was \$29.47. The sources from which the federal government's taxes came were: Customs duties, \$282,189,000; income and profits taxes, \$1,491,000,000; other miscellaneous internal revenue taxes, \$232,579,000; tax on circulation of national banks, \$4,304,000, and federal reserve franchise taxes, \$10,851,000.

Taxes collected by other than the federal government totalled \$4,857,958,000, or an average of \$88.90 for each person. General property taxes were \$2,229,280,000, or 37.7 per cent of the total. Special taxes, including inheritance, income, etc., contributed \$258,024,000; poll taxes \$28,190,000; licenses and permits, \$408,597,000, and special assessments, \$295,747,000.

The state governments collected \$847,468,000, an increase of 183 per cent over 1912; the counties collected \$742,331,000, an increase of 141 per cent; cities and other incorporated places collected \$1,427,329,000, an increase of about 50 per cent; townships collected \$151,215,000; school districts \$735,422,000 and all other civil divisions \$192,068,000.

TO BUILD HORACE MANN MEMORIAL

YELLOW SPRINGS, O. (AP)—An intellectual landmark of the middle west was lost on New Year's night when "Horace Mann House," one of the buildings of Antioch college was destroyed by fire.

The structure was the home of Dr. Mann, the pioneer educator, whom he was president of Antioch 79 years ago under the leadership of the western vanderboom for a number of New England intellectuals and other notable figures in the national life of that period. Among those entertained by President Mann were Ralph Waldo Emerson, Nathaniel Hawthorne, Edward Everett Hale, Daniel Webster and Henry Clay. Hawthorne found among the girls of Antioch college the "Maid of the Marble Faun."

The college was reorganized three years ago under the presidency of Arthur E. Morgan and now offers a liberal education, technical or professional training and actual experience in practical life. Half the students work while the other half study, in alternate periods of five weeks. The loss of the house is a handicap to Antioch, but steps were at once taken to replace it with a modern structure, much more serviceable to modern needs. The new building is to be called the Horace Mann Memorial, and alumni of the college are subscribing to its erection.

Uster Business Men Urged to Study American Markets

BELFAST, (AP)—Returning from a trip to the United States, Robert J. McKeown, parliamentary secretary to the Uster ministry of commerce, urged Uster business men to visit the United States more frequently and study the market conditions in America. This, he said, would show that America could absorb everything Uster could produce.

Mr. McKeown said he returned with a feeling that something would be done in the near future to reduce the tariff on linen. If this were done it would greatly encourage trade here, he declared.
