Bubble Hargrave Poved That He Could Come Back

NEW YORK, (AP)—The comeback to major league stardom of Eugene ("Bubble") Hargrave, Cincinnati catcher, after 12 years of inconspicuous plodding up and down the diamond ladder, was one of the outstanding individual achievements of the 1923 season.

Hargrave, at the age of 31, when many stars are beginning to slip, has just come into his own as one of the hardest hitting and best around backstops in the game. Eight years ago he batted .155 in the National League and was shut out back to the bushes. Last season he hit .323 and fielded .988.

Hargrave, whose career is an object lesson in perseverance, started as a catcher back in 1911 with Terre Haute when only 19. He worked for the Hoosier team for three years and then had his first major league try-out with the Chicago Nationals.

He failed to make good, batting around .200 for two seasons, and was sent to Kansas City in the American Association. A couple of seasons later he went down another notch, to Memphis, in the Southern Association.

At St. Paul, in 1918, Hargrave found himself. In 1921, he was purchased for \$10,000 by the Reds and today is one of the most important cogs in the machine which finished second last season and has high hopes of a championship this year.

Hargrave took part in 12 double plays last year and had 90 assists in 163 games. He hit 23 doubles, nine triples and ten home runs.

Income Tax Tips

Deductions for business expenses from the largest claim in the returns of many taxpayers. All the ordinary and necessary expenses in carrying on any business, trade, profession, or vocation are allowable deductions.

Typical expenses of a mercantile establishment are amounts paid for hire of employees, rent, light, heat, and water, telephone, advertising, insurance, delivery expenses, the cost of operating delivery wagons and motor trucks, and incidental repairs to such vehicles. The expenses of a manufacturing business include labor, raw material, light, heat, and power, selling cost, administration, and similar charges.

A professional man may claim as deductions the cost of supplies used by him in his practice, expenses paid in the operation and repair of an automobile used in making professional calls, dues to a professional society, subscriptions to professional journals, office rent the expenses of fuel, light, water, and telephone used in his office, and the hire of assistants.

The farmer may deduct all amounts paid in the production and harvesting of his crops, including labor, cost of seed, and fertilizer used, cost of minor repairs to farm buildings that not the dwelling, fences, machinery, and small tools used up in the course of a year or two.

Traveling expenses, when the trip is solely on business, including the entire cost of meals and lodgings while away from home, are deductible.

Provisions for business expenses must have certain qualities to be allowed. They must relate to a business, trade, profession, or vocation in which the taxpayer has invested time or money for the purpose of a livelihood or profit. A business may be carried on by a taxpayer, even if all its activities are conducted by employees.

A taxpayer may conduct more than one trade or business and claim a deduction for the business expenses of each, provided he devotes sufficient time and attention to each.

Rhine Wines Sold At Auction. COLEBENCE, (AP)—Wine auctions in Coblenz, Mayence, Treves and other cities of the Rhine and Moselle district have been well attended this winter, despite the fact that the crop of grapes for the 1923 wine output was the poorest in a dozen years. But by offering last year's wines along with the wines of better years, the growers managed to dispose of virtually all of the vintage of 1923. One day's proceeds of a wine auction at Mayence, attended by buyers from Berlin and various other cities, amounted to 44,311 gold marks, or approximately \$11,000.
